A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the authority of a water and sewer utility to collect
- 3 voluntary contributions on behalf of a local library.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 13.143(a), (b), and (d), Water Code,
- 6 are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) A utility may implement as part of its billing process a
- 8 program under which the utility collects from its customers a
- 9 voluntary contribution, including a voluntary membership or
- 10 subscription fee, on behalf of a local library, a volunteer fire
- 11 department, or an emergency medical service.
- 12 (b) A utility that collects contributions under this
- 13 section shall provide each customer at the time that the customer
- 14 first becomes a customer, and at least annually thereafter, a
- 15 written statement:
- 16 (1) describing the procedure by which the customer may
- 17 make a contribution with the customer's bill payment;
- 18 (2) designating the <u>local library</u>, volunteer fire
- 19 department, or emergency medical service to which the utility will
- 20 deliver the contribution;
- 21 (3) informing the customer that a contribution is
- 22 voluntary; and
- 23 (4) describing the deductibility status of the
- 24 contribution under federal income tax law.

- 1 (d) The utility shall promptly deliver contributions that
- 2 it collects under this section to the designated <u>local library</u>,
- 3 volunteer fire department, or emergency medical service, except
- 4 that the utility may keep from the contributions an amount equal to
- 5 the lesser of:
- 6 (1) the utility's expenses in administering the
- 7 contribution program; or
- 8 (2) five percent of the amount collected as
- 9 contributions.
- 10 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
