- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 28.002, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsections (b-1), (b-2), (b-3), and (b-4) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (b-1) In this section, "common core state standards" means
- 9 the national curriculum standards developed by the Common Core
- 10 State Standards Initiative.
- 11 (b-2) The State Board of Education may not adopt common core
- 12 state standards to comply with a duty imposed under this chapter.
- 13 (b-3) A school district may not use common core state
- 14 standards to comply with the requirement to provide instruction in
- 15 the essential knowledge and skills at appropriate grade levels
- 16 under Subsection (c).
- 17 (b-4) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, a
- 18 school district or open-enrollment charter school may not be
- 19 required to offer any aspect of a common core state standards
- 20 <u>curriculum</u>.
- 21 SECTION 2. Section 39.023, Education Code, is amended by
- 22 adding Subsection (a-3) to read as follows:
- 23 <u>(a-3) The agency may not adopt or develop a</u>
- 24 criterion-referenced assessment instrument under this section

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- 1 based on common core state standards as defined by Section
- 2 <u>28.002(b-1).</u>
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
