1-19 relating to the composition of the housing and health services
 1-20 coordination council.

1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. Section 2306.1092(b), Government Code, is
 1-23 amended to read as follows:

1-24 (b) The council is composed of 17 [~~16~~] members consisting
 1-25 of:

- 1-26 (1) the director;
- 1-27 (2) one representative from each of the following
 1-28 agencies, appointed by the head of that agency:
 1-29 (A) the Office of Rural Affairs within the
 1-30 Department of Agriculture;
 1-31 (B) the Texas State Affordable Housing
 1-32 Corporation;
 1-33 (C) the Health and Human Services Commission;
 1-34 (D) the Department of Assistive and
 1-35 Rehabilitative Services;
 1-36 (E) the Department of Aging and Disability
 1-37 Services; ~~and~~
 1-38 (F) the Department of State Health Services; and
 1-39 (G) the Texas Veterans Commission;

1-40 (3) one representative from the Department of
 1-41 Agriculture who is:

- 1-42 (A) knowledgeable about the Texans Feeding
 1-43 Texans and Retire in Texas programs or similar programs; and
 1-44 (B) appointed by the head of that agency;

1-45 (4) one member who is:
 1-46 (A) a member of the Health and Human Services
 1-47 Commission Promoting Independence Advisory Committee; and
 1-48 (B) appointed by the governor; and

1-49 (5) one representative from each of the following
 1-50 interest groups, appointed by the governor:

- 1-51 (A) financial institutions;
- 1-52 (B) multifamily housing developers;
- 1-53 (C) health services entities;
- 1-54 (D) nonprofit organizations that advocate for
 1-55 affordable housing and consumer-directed long-term services and
 1-56 support;
- 1-57 (E) consumers of service-enriched housing;
- 1-58 (F) advocates for minority issues; and
- 1-59 (G) rural communities.

1-60 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
