- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 261.101(b), Family Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (b) If a professional has cause to believe that a child has
- 9 been abused or neglected or may be abused or neglected, or that a
- 10 child is a victim of an offense under Section 21.11, Penal Code, and
- 11 the professional has cause to believe that the child has been abused
- 12 as defined by Section 261.001 or 261.401, the professional shall
- 13 make a report not later than the 24th [48th] hour after the hour the
- 14 professional first suspects that the child has been or may be abused
- 15 or neglected or is a victim of an offense under Section 21.11, Penal
- 16 Code. A professional may not delegate to or rely on another person
- 17 to make the report. In this subsection, "professional" means an
- 18 individual who:
- 19 (1) is licensed or certified by the state or who is an
- 20 employee of a facility licensed, certified, or operated by the
- 21 state and who, in the normal course of official duties or duties for
- 22 which a license or certification is required, has direct contact
- 23 with children. The term includes teachers, nurses, doctors,
- 24 day-care employees, employees of a clinic or health care facility

- 1 that provides reproductive services, juvenile probation officers,
- 2 and juvenile detention or correctional officers; or
- 3 (2) is an employee of an institution of higher
- 4 education or a private or independent institution of higher
- 5 <u>education</u>, as those terms are defined by Section 61.003, Education
- 6 <u>Code</u>.
- 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
