- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 12, Agriculture Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Section 12.00291 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 12.00291. PLAN TO INCREASE OUTCOMES IN SUMMER FOOD
- 8 SERVICE PROGRAM. (a) The department shall develop a five-year plan
- 9 in collaboration with Baylor University's Texas Hunger Initiative
- 10 and implement no-cost provisions to increase outcomes in the summer
- 11 food service program under 42 U.S.C. Section 1761. The plan must
- 12 <u>include:</u>
- 13 (1) methods to increase participation by children
- 14 eligible to receive free or reduced-price school lunches; and
- 15 (2) strategies to increase access to summer meals in
- 16 rural areas for children eligible to receive free or reduced-price
- 17 school lunches.
- 18 (b) In developing the plan, the department shall involve any
- 19 appropriate department advisory committee that already exists and
- 20 shall seek the participation of relevant stakeholders.
- 21 (c) Not later than November 1, 2014, the department shall
- 22 submit to the governor, lieutenant governor, speaker of the house
- 23 of representatives, and appropriate standing committees of the
- 24 legislature the plan to be implemented over the next four years.

- 1 (d) The department may solicit and accept a gift, grant, or
- 2 donation from any source, including a foundation or private entity,
- 3 for the development of the plan. The plan may be developed and
- 4 <u>implemented</u> only if sufficient funds are available under this
- 5 <u>subsection for that purpose.</u>
- 6 (e) This section expires September 1, 2018.
- 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
