1 AN ACT 2 relating to the recitation of the pledges of allegiance to and display of the United States and state flags at and the observation 3 of a moment of silence at open-enrollment charter schools and other 4 5 public schools. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Section 25.082, Education Code, is amended by 7 amending Subsections (b), (c), and (d) and adding Subsection (b-1) 8 9 to read as follows: The board of trustees of each school district and the 10 (b) governing board of each open-enrollment charter school shall 11 12 require students, once during each school day at each campus [school in the district], to recite: 13 14 (1) the pledge of allegiance to the United States flag in accordance with 4 U.S.C. Section 4[, and its subsequent 15 16 amendments]; and (2) the pledge of allegiance to the state flag in 17 accordance with Subchapter C, Chapter 3100, Government Code. 18 (b-1) The board of trustees of each school district and the 19 governing board of each open-enrollment charter school shall 20 21 require that the United States and Texas flags be prominently displayed in accordance with 4 U.S.C. Sections 5-10 and Chapter 22 23 3100, Government Code, in each campus classroom to which a student is assigned at the time the pledges of allegiance to those flags are 24

1 recited. A district or school is not required to spend federal, 2 state, or local district or school funds to acquire flags required 3 under this subsection. A district or school may raise money or 4 accept gifts, grants, and donations to acquire flags required under 5 this subsection.

6 (c) On written request from a student's parent or guardian,
7 a school district <u>or open-enrollment charter school</u> shall excuse
8 the student from reciting a pledge of allegiance under Subsection
9 (b).

10 (d) The board of trustees of each school district and the governing board of each open-enrollment charter school shall 11 12 provide for the observance of one minute of silence at each campus [school in the district] following the recitation of the pledges of 13 14 allegiance to the United States and Texas flags under Subsection 15 (b). During the one-minute period, each student may, as the student chooses, reflect, pray, meditate, or engage in any other silent 16 17 activity that is not likely to interfere with or distract another Each teacher or other school employee in charge of 18 student. 19 students during that period shall ensure that each of those students remains silent and does not act in a manner that is likely 20 to interfere with or distract another student. 21

SECTION 2. (a) Sections 25.082(b), (c), and (d), Education Code, as amended by this Act, apply beginning with the 2013-2014 school year.

(b) Section 25.082(b-1), Education Code, as added by this
Act, applies beginning with the 2016-2017 school year.

27 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
