A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

	AN ACT

- 2 relating to certain actions taken by certain licensing authorities
- 3 regarding a license holder or applicant who has been convicted of a
- 4 Class C misdemeanor.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 53.021(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (a) A licensing authority may suspend or revoke a license,
- 9 disqualify a person from receiving a license, or deny to a person
- 10 the opportunity to take a licensing examination on the grounds that
- 11 the person has been convicted of an offense, other than an offense
- 12 punishable as a Class C misdemeanor, that:
- 13 (1) [an offense that] directly relates to the duties
- 14 and responsibilities of the licensed occupation;
- 15 (2) [an offense that] does not directly relate to the
- 16 duties and responsibilities of the licensed occupation and that was
- 17 committed less than five years before the date the person applies
- 18 for the license;
- 19 (3) <u>is</u> [an offense] listed in Section 3g, Article
- 20 42.12, Code of Criminal Procedure; or
- 21 (4) is a sexually violent offense, as defined by
- 22 Article 62.001, Code of Criminal Procedure.
- 23 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to an
- 24 application for, or a disciplinary proceeding regarding, a license

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- 1 or other authorization that is pending with a licensing authority
- 2 on the effective date of this Act or an application filed or a
- 3 disciplinary proceeding commenced on or after that date.
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
