A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to funding for public school career and technology 3 programs. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Sections 42.154(a) and (c), Education Code, are amended to read as follows: 6 (a) For each full-time equivalent student in average daily 7 attendance in an approved career and technology education program 8 in grades eight [nine] through 12 or in career and technology 9 education programs for students with disabilities in grades seven 10 11 through 12, a district is entitled to: 12 (1) an annual allotment equal to the adjusted basic 13 allotment multiplied by a weight of 1.35; and 14 (2) \$50, if the student is enrolled in: 15 (A) two or more advanced career and technology education classes for a total of three or more credits; or 16 an advanced course as part of a tech-prep 17 (B) program under Subchapter T, Chapter 61. 18 (c) Funds allocated under this section, other than 19 an indirect cost allotment established under State Board of Education 20 21 rule, must be used in providing career and technology education programs in grades eight [nine] through 12 or career and technology 22 23 education programs for students with disabilities in grades seven through 12 under Sections 29.182, 29.183, and 29.184. 24
