4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 266.001, Family Code, is amended by
6	adding Subdivision (6) to read as follows:
7	(6) "Psychotropic drug" has the meaning assigned by
8	<u>Section 261.111.</u>
9	SECTION 2. Section 266.004, Family Code, is amended by
10	adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
11	(a-1) Consent to the administration of a psychotropic drug
12	is valid only if:
13	(1) the consent is given voluntarily and without
14	coercive or undue influence;
15	(2) the health care provider administering the
16	psychotropic drug or a person designated by that health care
17	provider provides the following information to the person
18	authorized by law to consent for the foster child:
19	(A) the specific condition to be treated;
20	(B) the beneficial effects on that condition

expected from the drug;

(C) the probable health and mental health

(D) the probable clinically significant side

- 1 effects and risks associated with the drug;
- 2 (E) the generally accepted alternatives to the
- 3 drug, if any, and the reasons the health care provider recommends
- 4 that the alternatives be rejected; and
- 5 (F) the proposed course of the drug;
- 6 (3) the person authorized by law to consent is
- 7 informed in writing that consent may be revoked; and
- 8 <u>(4) the consent is evidenced in the foster child's</u>
- 9 health passport or equivalent record by a signed form or statement
- 10 of the health care provider administering the psychotropic drug or
- 11 <u>a person designated by that health care provider that documents</u>
- 12 that consent was given by the appropriate person and the
- 13 circumstances under which the consent was obtained.
- 14 SECTION 3. The heading to Subchapter A, Chapter 266, Family
- 15 Code, is repealed.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
