## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to who is a minor for the purposes of the Alcoholic 3 Beverage Code. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 2.02(c), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is 5 amended to read as follows: 6 (c) An adult who is 21 years of age or older or at least 18 7 years of age and a member of the United States armed forces on 8 9 active duty is liable for damages proximately caused by the intoxication of a minor under the age of 18 if: 10 11 (1) the adult is not: 12 (A) the minor's parent, guardian, or spouse; or 13 an adult in whose custody the minor has been (B) committed by a court; and 14 (2) the adult knowingly: 15 served or provided to the minor any of the 16 (A) alcoholic beverages that contributed to the minor's intoxication; 17 18 οr (B) allowed the minor to be served or provided 19 any of the alcoholic beverages that contributed to the minor's 20 21 intoxication on the premises owned or leased by the adult. SECTION 2. Sections 16.09(c) and (d), Alcoholic Beverage 22 23 Code, are amended to read as follows: (c) Wine shipped by the holder of a winery permit may not be 24

No. 892 1 delivered to any person other than: 2 (1) the person who purchased the wine; 3 (2) a recipient designated in advance by such purchaser; or 4 5 a person at the delivery address who is age 21 or (3) over or at least 18 years of age and a member of the United States 6 7 armed forces on active duty. 8 (d) Wine may be delivered only to a person who is age 21 or over or at least 18 years of age and a member of the United States 9 armed forces on active duty after the person accepting the package: 10 (1) presents valid proof of identity and age and, if 11 12 applicable, proof of active duty service in the United States armed 13 forces; and 14 (2) personally signs a receipt acknowledging delivery 15 of the package. 16 SECTION 3. Sections 22.13(a) and (b), Alcoholic Beverage 17 Code, are amended to read as follows: Except as provided by Subsection (b), a [A] package 18 (a) 19 store permittee may not knowingly utilize or employ any person under the age of 21 to work on the premises of a package store in any 20 capacity or to deliver alcohol off the premises of a package store. 21 A package store permittee may employ [This section shall 22 (b) not apply to] a person who is at least 18 years of age and a member 23 24 of the United States armed forces on active duty [was under the age of 21 and employed by a package store on September 1, 1995]. 25 SECTION 4. Sections 54.05(b) and (c), Alcoholic Beverage 26 27 Code, are amended to read as follows:

1 (b) Wine sold or shipped by a holder of an out-of-state 2 winery direct shipper's permit may not be delivered to any person 3 other than:

4 (1) the person who purchased the wine;
5 (2) a recipient designated in advance by such
6 purchaser; or
7 (3) a person at the delivery address who is age 21 or

8 over <u>or at least 18 years of age and a member of the United States</u>
9 <u>armed forces on active duty</u>.

10 (c) Wine may be delivered only to a person who is age 21 or 11 over <u>or at least 18 years of age and a member of the United States</u> 12 <u>armed forces on active duty</u> after the person accepting the package: 13 (1) presents valid proof of identity and age <u>and, if</u> 14 <u>applicable, proof of active duty service in the United States armed</u> 15 force<u>s</u>; and

16 (2) personally signs a receipt acknowledging delivery17 of the package.

SECTION 5. Section 102.19, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 102.19. PROMOTIONAL GIFT WINE. A holder of a winery 20 permit may give one or more unopened bottles of Texas-made wine 21 produced or bottled by the winery to a person 21 years of age or 22 older or at least 18 years of age and a member of the United States 23 24 armed forces on active duty on the premises of a convention center or civic center that holds a mixed beverage permit if no charge is 25 26 made by the winery or by the mixed beverage permittee for the wine. A recipient of a bottle of wine under this section must take the 27

2 permittee.

3 SECTION 6. Section 106.01, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is 4 amended to read as follows:

5 Sec. 106.01. DEFINITION. In this code, "minor" means a 6 person under 21 years of age. <u>The term does not include a person who</u> 7 <u>is at least 18 years of age and a member of the United States armed</u> 8 forces on active duty.

9 SECTION 7. Section 106.03(b), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is 10 amended to read as follows:

(b) A person who sells a minor an alcoholic beverage does 11 12 not commit an offense if the minor falsely represents the minor [himself] to be 21 years old or older or at least 18 years of age and 13 14 a member of the United States armed forces on active duty by 15 displaying an apparently valid proof of identification that contains a physical description and photograph consistent with the 16 17 minor's appearance, purports to establish that the minor is 21 years of age or older or at least 18 years of age and a member of the 18 United States armed forces on active duty, and was issued by a 19 governmental agency. The proof of identification may include a 20 21 driver's license or identification card issued by the Department of Public Safety, a passport, or a military identification card. 22

23 SECTION 8. Section 106.07(a), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
24 amended to read as follows:

(a) A minor commits an offense if <u>the minor:</u>
 (1) [he] falsely states <u>to a person engaged in selling</u>
 or serving alcoholic beverages that the minor [he] is:

1 (A) 21 years of age or older; or 2 (B) at least 18 years of age and a member of the 3 United States armed forces on active duty; or 4 (2) presents any document to a person engaged in selling or serving alcoholic beverages that indicates the minor 5 6 [<del>he</del>] is: 7 (A) 21 years of age or older; or 8 (B) at least 18 years of age and a member of the United States armed forces on active duty [to a person engaged in 9 10 selling or serving alcoholic beverages]. SECTION 9. Section 110.054, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is 11 amended to read as follows: 12 Sec. 110.054. DELIVERY OF WINE IN A DRY AREA. 13 A package store that participates in the program may ship wine under Section 14 15 110.053 to a person who resides in a dry area if: 16 (1) the delivery is made by the holder of a carrier 17 permit; and (2) the package is clearly labeled as requiring the 18 signature of a person 21 years of age or older or at least 18 years 19 of age and a member of the United States armed forces on active duty 20 for delivery. 21 SECTION 10. Section 49.02(e), Penal Code, is amended to 22 read as follows: 23 24 (e) An offense under this section committed by a person who is a minor for the purposes of the Alcoholic Beverage Code [younger 25 26 than 21 years of age] is punishable in the same manner as if the minor committed an offense to which Section 106.071, Alcoholic 27

Beverage Code, applies.
 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
