## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the

3 use of automated external defibrillators in secondary education

4 curriculum.

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 28.0023, Education Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsections (b) and (c) and adding Subsections (d), (e),
- 8 (f), and (g) to read as follows:
- 9 (b) The State Board of Education by rule shall require
- 10 [include elements relating to] instruction in cardiopulmonary
- 11 resuscitation and the use of an automated external defibrillator
- 12 for students in grades 7 through 12 [as part of the essential
- 13 knowledge and skills of the health curriculum under Section
- 14  $\frac{28.002(a)(2)(B)}{}$ ].
- 15 (c) A school district or open-enrollment charter [This
- 16 subsection applies only to a private school that receives an
- 17 automated external defibrillator from the agency or receives
- 18 funding from the agency to purchase or lease an automated external
- 19 defibrillator. A private] school shall provide instruction to
- 20 students in grades 7 through 12 in cardiopulmonary resuscitation
- 21 and the use of an automated external defibrillator in a manner
- 22 consistent with the requirements of this section and State Board of
- 23 Education rules adopted under this section. The instruction may be
- 24 provided as a part of any course. A student shall receive the

- 1 <u>instruction at least once before graduation.</u>
- 2 (d) A school administrator may waive the curriculum
- 3 requirement under this section for an eligible student who has a
- 4 disability.
- 5 (e) Cardiopulmonary resuscitation and automated external
- 6 defibrillator instruction must include cardiopulmonary
- 7 resuscitation and automated external defibrillator training that
- 8 has been developed:
- 9 (1) by the American Heart Association or the American
- 10 Red Cross; or
- 11 (2) using nationally recognized, evidence-based
- 12 guidelines for emergency cardiovascular care and incorporating
- 13 psychomotor skills to support the instruction.
- (f) For purposes of Subsection (e), "psychomotor skills"
- 15 means hands-on practice to support cognitive learning. The term
- 16 does not include cognitive-only instruction and training.
- 17 (g) A school district or open-enrollment charter school may
- 18 use emergency medical technicians, paramedics, police officers,
- 19 firefighters, representatives of the American Heart Association or
- 20 the American Red Cross, teachers, other school employees, or other
- 21 similarly qualified individuals to provide instruction and
- 22 training under this section. Instruction provided under this
- 23 <u>section</u> is not required to result in certification in
- 24 cardiopulmonary resuscitation or the use of an automated external
- 25 defibrillator. If instruction is intended to result in
- 26 <u>certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation or the use of an</u>
- 27 automated external defibrillator, the course instructor must be

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- 1 <u>authorized to provide the instruction by the American Heart</u>
- 2 Association, the American Red Cross, or a similar nationally
- 3 recognized association.
- 4 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2014-2015
- 5 school year.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- $7\,$  a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
