- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
- amended by adding Section 28.0256 to read as follows: 7
- Sec. 28.0256. TEXAS STATE SEAL OF BILINGUALISM AND 8
- BILITERACY. (a) In this section, "seal" means the Texas State Seal 9
- of Bilingualism and Biliteracy established under Subsection (b). 10
- (b) The agency shall establish a seal to recognize high 11
- 12 school graduates who have attained a high level of proficiency in
- comprehending, speaking, reading, and writing in both English and a 13
- 14 language other than English.
- 15 (c) The agency shall:
- 16 (1) determine minimum requirements for earning the
- 17 seal; and

- 18 (2) prepare and deliver to a participating school
- district an insignia that can be affixed or stamped on the diploma 19
- or transcript of a student who has satisfied requirements for 20
- 21 earning the seal.
- 22 (d) The board of trustees of a school district may choose
- 23 whether to offer the seal to students who satisfy the requirements
- 24 for earning the seal as determined by the agency.

- 1 (e) Each school district that offers the seal to an eligible
- 2 student shall:
- 3 (1) maintain appropriate records to identify students
- 4 who have earned the seal; and
- 5 (2) affix the seal's insignia to the diploma or
- 6 transcript of each student who has satisfied requirements for
- 7 <u>earning the seal.</u>
- 8 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2013-2014
- 9 school year.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
