4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 1, Election Code, is amended by adding
6	Section 1.016 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 1.016. RESIDENCE FOR CERTAIN REGISTERED VOTERS.
8	(a) For purposes of registration under this code, a person's
9	residence is established at the first residence address in the
10	following list that is applicable to the person:
11	(1) the address the person claims as a homestead in
12	this state;
13	(2) the address stated on a driver's license issued to
14	the person by the Department of Public Safety that has not expired
15	or, if the person has notified the department of a change of address
16	under Section 521.054, Transportation Code, the new address
17	contained in the notification;
18	(3) the address stated on a personal identification
19	card issued to the person by the Department of Public Safety that
20	has not expired or, if the person has notified the department of a
21	change of address under Section 521.054, Transportation Code, the
22	new address contained in the notification;
23	(4) the address stated on a license to carry a
24	concealed handgun issued to the person by the Department of Public

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1	Safety that has not expired or, if the person has notified the
2	department of a change of address under Section 411.181, Government
3	Code, the new address contained in the notification; or
4	(5) an address corresponding to a residence at which
5	the person receives mail.
6	(b) The address described by Subsection (a)(5) may not be a
7	commercial post office box or similar location that does not
8	correspond to a residence.
9	(c) This section does not apply to:
10	(1) a person who is a member of the armed forces of the
11	United States or the spouse or a dependent of a member; or
12	(2) a person enrolled as a full-time student at an
13	institution of higher education.
14	(d) The secretary of state shall adopt rules as necessary to
15	implement this section.

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16 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
