- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 552.0038(b), (h), and (i), Government
- 6 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) Except as provided by this section [Subsections (c)
- 8 through (i)], the governing body of a public retirement system is
- 9 subject to this chapter in the same manner as a governmental body.
- 10 (h) [The retirement system has sole discretion in
- 11 determining whether a record is subject to this section. [ For
- 12 purposes of this section, a record includes any identifying
- 13 information about a person, living or deceased, who is or was a
- 14 member, annuitant, retiree, beneficiary, alternate payee, program
- 15 participant, or person eligible for benefits from the retirement
- 16 system under any retirement plan or program administered by the
- 17 retirement system.
- 18 (i) To the extent of a conflict between this section and any
- 19 other law with respect to the confidential information held by a
- 20 public retirement system [or other entity described by Subsection
- 21 <del>(c)</del>] concerning an individual member, annuitant, retiree,
- 22 beneficiary, alternate payee, program participant, or person
- 23 eligible for benefits from the retirement system, this section

- 5 SECTION 2. Sections 552.0038(c), (d), and (f), Government
- 6 Code, are repealed.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
