1 AN ACT

2 relating to state assessment of public school students.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Sections 28.014(c) and (f), Education Code, are

5 amended to read as follows:

- 6 (c) The agency, in consultation with the Texas Higher 7 Education Coordinating Board, shall adopt an end-of-course assessment instrument for each course developed under this section 8 to ensure the rigor of the course. A school district shall, in accordance with State Board of Education rules, administer the 10 11 end-of-course assessment instrument to a student enrolled in a 12 course developed under this section. A [Each school] district may [shall] adopt a policy that requires a student's performance on the 13 14 end-of-course assessment instrument to account for not more than 15 percent of the student's final grade for the course. [A student's 15 16 performance on an end-of-course assessment instrument administered under this subsection may be used, on a scale of 0-40, in 17 calculating whether the student satisfies the graduation 18 requirements established under Section 39.025. 19
- (f) To the extent applicable, the commissioner shall draw from curricula and instructional materials developed under <u>Section</u> [Sections] 28.008 [and 61.0763] in developing a course and related instructional materials under this section. Not later than September 1, 2010, the State Board of Education shall adopt

- 1 essential knowledge and skills for each course developed under this
- 2 section. The State Board of Education shall make each course
- 3 developed under this section and the related instructional
- 4 materials available to school districts not later than the
- 5 2014-2015 school year. [As required by Subsection (c), a school
- 6 district shall adopt a policy requiring a student's performance on
- 7 an end-of-course assessment instrument administered under that
- 8 subsection to account for 15 percent of the student's grade for a
- 9 course developed under this section not later than the 2014-2015
- 10 school year.] This subsection expires September 1, 2015.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 39.023(c), Education Code, is amended to

- 13 (c) The agency shall also adopt end-of-course assessment
- 14 instruments for secondary-level courses in Algebra I, Algebra II,
- 15 geometry, biology, chemistry, physics, English I, English II,
- 16 English III, world geography, world history, and United States
- 17 history. The Algebra I, Algebra II, and geometry end-of-course
- 18 assessment instruments must be administered with the aid of
- 19 technology. A school district shall comply with State Board of
- 20 Education rules regarding administration of the assessment
- 21 instruments listed in this subsection and may [shall] adopt a
- 22 policy that requires a student's performance on an end-of-course
- 23 assessment instrument for a course listed in this subsection in
- 24 which the student is enrolled to account for not more than 15
- 25 percent of the student's final grade for the course. [If a student
- 26 retakes an end-of-course assessment instrument for a course listed
- 27 in this subsection, as provided by Section 39.025, a school

- SECTION 3. Section 39.025, Education Code, is amended by amending Subsections (a), (a-1), (a-2), (a-3), (b), (b-2), and (e) and adding Subsections (a-4) and (a-5) to read as follows:

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16 (a) The commissioner shall adopt rules requiring a student 17 participating in the recommended or advanced high school program to be administered each end-of-course assessment instrument listed in 18 19 Section 39.023(c) and requiring a student participating in the minimum high school program to be administered an end-of-course 20 assessment instrument listed in Section 39.023(c) only for a course 21 in which the student is enrolled and for which an end-of-course 22 assessment instrument is administered. [A student is required to 23 24 achieve, in each subject in the foundation curriculum under Section 28.002(a)(1), a cumulative score that is at least equal to the 25 26 product of the number of end-of-course assessment instruments administered to the student in that subject and a scale score that 27

A student must achieve a minimum score as determined by the commissioner to be within a reasonable range of the scale score under Section 39.0241(a) on an end-of-course assessment instrument for the score to count towards the student's cumulative score. For purposes of this subsection, a student's cumulative score is determined using the student's highest score on each end-of-course assessment instrument administered to the student. A student may not receive a high school diploma until the student has performed satisfactorily on the end-of-course assessment instruments in the manner provided under this subsection. This subsection does not require a student to demonstrate readiness to enroll in an institution of higher education. (a-1) The commissioner by rule shall determine a method by assessment instrument determined or another

- 3 campus-level planning and decision-making committee established
- 4 under Section 11.251 may limit the administration of locally

- 6 or a lower percentage of the instructional days in any school year.
- 7 (b) The prohibition prescribed by this section does not
- 8 apply to the administration of a college preparation assessment
- 9 instrument, an advanced placement test, or an international
- 10 baccalaureate examination [, or an assessment instrument
- 11 administered under Section 39.023].
- 12 <u>(c) The commissioner may adopt rules as necessary to</u>
- 13 <u>administer this section.</u>
- 14 SECTION 5. Section 39.025, Education Code, as amended by
- 15 this Act, applies only to students entering the ninth grade during
- 16 the 2013-2014 school year or a later school year. For students
- 17 entering a grade above ninth grade during the 2013-2014 school
- 18 year, Section 39.025, Education Code, as that section existed
- 19 before amendment by this Act, applies, and that section is
- 20 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 21 SECTION 6. This Act applies beginning with the 2013-2014
- 22 school year.
- 23 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
