## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to providing human sexuality instruction in public 3 schools.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 28.004(e), Education Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:

7 (e) Any course materials and instruction relating to human 8 sexuality, sexually transmitted diseases, or human 9 immunodeficiency virus or acquired immune deficiency syndrome 10 shall be selected by the board of trustees with the advice of the 11 local school health advisory council and [must]:

12 (1) <u>must</u> present abstinence from sexual activity as 13 the preferred choice of behavior in relationship to all sexual 14 activity for unmarried persons of school age;

15 (2) <u>must</u> devote more attention to abstinence from 16 sexual activity than to any other behavior;

(3) <u>must</u> emphasize that abstinence from sexual activity, if used consistently and correctly, is the only method that is 100 percent effective in preventing pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases, infection with human immunodeficiency virus or acquired immune deficiency syndrome, and the emotional trauma associated with adolescent sexual activity;

(4) <u>must</u> direct adolescents to a standard of behavior
 in which abstinence from sexual activity before marriage is the

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1 most effective way to prevent pregnancy, sexually transmitted 2 diseases, and infection with human immunodeficiency virus or 3 acquired immune deficiency syndrome; [and]

4 (5) <u>must</u> teach contraception and condom use in terms
5 of human use reality rates instead of theoretical laboratory rates,
6 if instruction on contraception and condoms is included in
7 curriculum content; and

8 (6) may not teach or present information relating to
9 abortion, including referrals for abortion.

SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2013-2014 school year.

12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
