H.B. No. 1091

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to firefighters and emergency medical technicians who bring certain claims for benefits or compensation. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 607.052(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 Notwithstanding any other law, this subchapter applies 7 (a) only to a firefighter or emergency medical technician who: 8 (1) on becoming employed, [or] during employment, or 9 on leaving employment as a firefighter or emergency medical 10 11 technician, received a physical examination that failed to reveal 12 evidence of the illness or disease for which benefits or compensation are sought using a presumption established by this 13 14 subchapter; (2) 15 is employed for five or more years as a firefighter 16 or emergency medical technician; and seeks benefits or compensation for a disease or 17 (3) 18 illness covered by this subchapter that is discovered during employment as a firefighter or emergency medical technician or not 19 later than the fifth anniversary of the last date of employment as a 20 21 firefighter or emergency medical technician. SECTION 2. Section 607.052(a), Government Code, as amended 22 by this Act, applies only to a firefighter or emergency medical 23 technician who brings a claim for benefits or compensation on or 24

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1 after the effective date of this Act. A firefighter or emergency 2 medical technician who brings a claim for benefits or compensation 3 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in 4 effect on the date the claim is made, and the former law is 5 continued in effect for that purpose.

6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
