1-19 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to the composition of the Texas Private Security Board.
1-22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
1-23 SECTION 1. Section 1702.021(a), Occupations Code, is
1-24 amended to read as follows:
1-25 (a) The Texas Private Security Board consists of seven
1-26 members appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the
1-27 senate as follows:
1-28 (1) three [~~four~~] public members, each of whom is a
1-29 citizen of the United States;
1-30 (2) one member who is licensed under this chapter as a
1-31 private investigator;
1-32 (3) one member who is licensed under this chapter as an
1-33 alarm systems company; [~~and~~]
1-34 (4) one member who is licensed under this chapter as
1-35 the owner or operator of a guard company; and
1-36 (5) one member who is licensed under this chapter as a
1-37 locksmith.
1-38 SECTION 2. Not later than February 1, 2015, the governor
1-39 shall appoint the members of the Texas Private Security Board
1-40 necessary to ensure that the composition of the board complies with
1-41 Section 1702.021, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act.
1-42 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
1-43 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
1-44 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
1-45 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
1-46 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
