A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to documents filed with certain courts.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 51.304, Government Code, is amended by
- 5 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c) to read as
- 6 follows:
- 7 (b) The plan must:
- 8 (1) require the recording and filing of original
- 9 instruments, records, and minutes within a specified time after
- 10 presentation to the district clerk;
- 11 (2) require [permit] the use of original paper records
- 12 in a proceeding before the court;
- 13 (3) provide standards for the organizing,
- 14 identifying, coding, and indexing of records so a record can be
- 15 retrieved rapidly and the reproduced record can be certified as a
- 16 true and correct copy;
- 17 (4) provide for the use of materials to reproduce
- 18 records and, if appropriate to the method by which records are
- 19 stored, provide for the use of processes relating to the
- 20 development, fixation, and washing of the photographic duplicates,
- 21 that are of a quality approved for permanent photographic records
- 22 by the American National Standards Institute, or another nationally
- 23 recognized entity that establishes archival standards for mediums
- 24 used to store data and records; and

- 1 (5) provide for the permanent retention of records,
- 2 including security provisions to guard against physical loss,
- 3 alteration, and deterioration.
- 4 (c) The plan adopted by the district clerk under this
- 5 section must require that all original paper documents in a case be
- 6 retained by the clerk pending the final disposition of all
- 7 proceedings in the case.
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 51.805(a), Government Code, is amended
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 (a) A receiving station, on completion of an electronic
- 11 filing, shall:
- 12 (1) transmit data to the appropriate court as required
- 13 as an <u>original paper document</u>; and
- 14 (2) distribute data as required by statute or rule.
- 15 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply to a
- 16 document filed on or after the effective date of this Act. A
- 17 document filed before the effective date of this Act is governed by
- 18 the law in effect on the date the document was filed, and that law is
- 19 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 20 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
