1 AN ACT 2 relating to the duties of the Texas Crime Stoppers Council to 3 encourage individuals to report criminal activity related to trafficking of persons. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 414.005, Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 Sec. 414.005. DUTIES. The council shall: 8 9 (1)encourage, advise, and assist in the creation of crime stoppers organizations; 10 foster the detection of crime 11 (2) and encourage 12 persons to report information about criminal acts; 13 (3) encourage news and other media to broadcast 14 reenactments and to inform the public of the functions of crime stoppers organizations' operations and programs; 15 16 (4) promote the process of crime stoppers organizations to forward information about criminal acts to the 17 appropriate law enforcement agencies; 18 19 (5) help law enforcement agencies detect and combat crime by increasing the flow of information to and between law 20 21 enforcement agencies; 22 (6) create specialized programs targeted at detecting 23 specific crimes or types of crimes, including at least one program 24 that:

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1 (A) encourages individuals to report sex 2 offenders who have failed to register under Chapter 62, Code of Criminal Procedure; [and] 3 4 (B) encourages individuals to report criminal 5 activity relating to the trafficking of persons, as described under Chapter 20A, Penal Code; and 6 (C) financially rewards each individual 7 who 8 makes a report described by Paragraph (A) or (B) that leads or substantially contributes to the arrest or apprehension: 9 (i) of a sex offender who has failed to 10 register under Chapter 62, Code of Criminal Procedure; or 11 12 (ii) of a person suspected of engaging in conduct that constitutes an offense under Chapter 20A, Penal Code; 13 14 and 15 (7) encourage, advise, and assist crime stoppers implementing any programs created 16 organizations in under 17 Subdivision (6), including a program specifically described by Subdivision (6). 18 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 21 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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23 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
