- 2 relating to a pilot program for a three-year high school diploma
- 3 plan and cost-neutral expansion of full-day prekindergarten
- 4 programs.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 28.0255 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 28.0255. PILOT PROGRAM: THREE-YEAR HIGH SCHOOL
- 9 DIPLOMA PLAN. (a) In this section, "certificate program," "public
- 10 junior college," "public state college," and "public technical
- 11 institute" have the meanings assigned by Section 61.003.
- 12 (b) This section applies only to a school district:
- (1) with an enrollment of more than 150,000 students;
- 14 and
- 15 (2) located primarily in a county that has a
- 16 population of 2.2 million or more and that is adjacent to a county
- 17 with a population of more than 600,000.
- 18 <u>(c) A school district to which this section applies may</u>
- 19 develop and implement a pilot program for students who wish to
- 20 obtain a high school diploma after completion of three years of
- 21 secondary school attendance as an alternative to the traditional
- 22 four-year period of attendance. The program must include
- 23 partnerships between the school district and public junior
- 24 colleges, public technical institutes, public state colleges, and

- 1 any other public postsecondary institutions in this state offering
- 2 academic or technical education or vocational training under a
- 3 certificate program or an associate degree program to facilitate
- 4 the prompt enrollment of students in those institutions after high
- 5 school graduation under the program.
- 6 (d) Participation by a student in the program must be
- 7 voluntary, with approval of the student's parent. A student who
- 8 agrees to participate in the program may, on request, discontinue
- 9 participation and resume taking courses under a high school program
- 10 based on a traditional four-year period of attendance.
- 11 (e) Notwithstanding Section 28.025, the school district
- 12 shall specify the curriculum requirements for receiving a high
- 13 school diploma under the program. The curriculum requirements must
- 14 ensure that a student who graduates under the program possesses
- 15 <u>sufficient knowledge and skills in English language arts and</u>
- 16 mathematics to be capable of performing successfully in public
- 17 junior college-level courses.
- 18 (f) The school district shall submit to the commissioner for
- 19 approval the district's proposal regarding the scope of the program
- 20 and the program curriculum requirements. The school district shall
- 21 also submit the proposed curriculum requirements to the State Board
- 22 of Education for comment. The district may not implement the
- 23 program before obtaining the commissioner's approval of the scope
- 24 of the program and the program curriculum requirements.
- 25 (g) A student is entitled to a high school diploma if the
- 26 student:
- 27 (1) successfully complies with the curriculum

- 1 requirements specified under Subsection (e); and
- 2 (2) performs satisfactorily, as determined by the
- 3 commissioner under Subsection (h), on end-of-course assessment
- 4 instruments listed under Section 39.023(c) for courses in which the
- 5 student was enrolled.
- 6 (h) For purposes of Subsection (g)(2), the commissioner
- 7 shall determine the level of satisfactory performance on applicable
- 8 end-of-course assessment instruments administered to a student.
- 9 (i) The school district shall report the academic
- 10 achievement record of students who have completed the program on a
- 11 transcript that clearly identifies the program and distinguishes
- 12 the program from the other high school programs based on a
- 13 traditional four-year period of attendance.
- 14 (j) A student who has received a diploma under the program
- 15 is exempt from the compulsory school attendance requirements under
- 16 <u>Section 25.085.</u>
- 17 (k) To the extent this section conflicts with any other
- 18 provision of this code or rule adopted under this code, this section
- 19 prevails.
- 20 (1) This section expires September 1, 2023.
- 21 SECTION 2. Subchapter E, Chapter 42, Education Code, is
- 22 amended by adding Section 42.2526 to read as follows:
- 23 <u>Sec. 42.2526. ADJUSTMENT FOR DISTRICT OPERATING PILOT</u>
- 24 PROGRAM. (a) This section applies only to a school district
- 25 operating a pilot program authorized by Section 28.0255.
- 26 (b) Beginning with the first school year that follows the
- 27 first school year in which students receive high school diplomas

- 1 under the pilot program authorized by Section 28.0255 and
- 2 continuing for every subsequent school year that the district
- 3 operates the pilot program, the commissioner shall provide funding
- 4 for the district's prekindergarten program under Section 29.153 on
- 5 <u>a full-day basis for a number of prekindergarten students equal to</u>
- 6 twice the number of students who received a high school diploma
- 7 under the pilot program authorized by Section 28.0255 during the
- 8 preceding school year.
- 9 (c) This section expires September 1, 2023.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
