## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the use of human remains in the training of search and
- 3 rescue animals.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 691.022(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The board shall distribute bodies and anatomical
- 8 specimens to persons and institutions authorized to receive them.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 691.0225, Health and Safety Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 691.0225. INFORMATIONAL DOCUMENT. The board shall
- 12 develop a document to inform a person making a gift of a decedent's
- 13 body or anatomical specimen for purposes of education, including
- 14 training of search and rescue animals, or research of the risks and
- 15 benefits associated with donation. The board shall make the
- 16 document available on the board's Internet website.
- SECTION 3. Section 691.023(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 (a) An officer, employee, or representative of the state, of
- 20 a political subdivision, or of an institution having charge or
- 21 control of a body not claimed for burial or a body required to be
- 22 buried at public expense shall:
- 23 (1) notify the board or the board's representative of
- 24 the body's existence when the body comes into the person's

- 1 possession, charge, or control if notified in writing to do so by
- 2 the board or the board's representative;
- 3 (2) deliver the body in accordance with the direction
- 4 of the board; and
- 5 (3) allow the board, the board's representative, or a
- 6 physician designated by the board who complies with this chapter to
- 7 remove the body to be used for the advancement of medical science or
- 8 for the training of search and rescue animals.
- 9 SECTION 4. Section 691.025(d), Health and Safety Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 (d) A relative of the deceased may claim the body within 60
- 12 days after the body has been delivered to an institution or other
- 13 person or entity authorized to receive the body. The body shall be
- 14 released without charge.
- 15 SECTION 5. Section 691.026, Health and Safety Code, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 691.026. BODY OF TRAVELER. If an unclaimed body is the
- 18 body of a traveler who died suddenly, the board shall direct the
- 19 person or institution receiving the body to retain the body for six
- 20 months for purposes of identification.
- SECTION 6. Section 691.028(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 22 amended to read as follows:
- 23 (a) An adult living in this state who is of sound mind may
- 24 donate the adult's [his] body by will or other written instrument to
- 25 the board, a medical or dental school, or another donee authorized
- 26 by the board, to be used for the advancement of medical science or
- 27 for the training of search and rescue animals.

- 1 SECTION 7. Section 691.030, Health and Safety Code, is
- 2 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to
- 3 read as follows:
- 4 (a) The board or the board's representative shall
- 5 distribute bodies donated to it and may redistribute bodies donated
- 6 to medical or dental schools or other donees authorized by the board
- 7 to schools and colleges of chiropractic, osteopathy, medicine, or
- 8 dentistry incorporated in this state, to physicians, to persons who
- 9 train animals to assist in search and rescue activities conducted
- 10 by a law enforcement agency, and to other persons as provided by
- 11 this section.
- 12 <u>(a-1)</u> In making a distribution or redistribution to a person
- 13 who trains search and rescue animals, the board or the board's
- 14 representative must ensure that the person will use the body only to
- 15 assist a law enforcement agency in the conduct of search and rescue
- 16 activities.
- 17 SECTION 8. Sections 691.033(a), (c), and (d), Health and
- 18 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 19 (a) To further medical science or provide specific
- 20 <u>training</u>, a school, college, or person designated by the board may
- 21 use, dissect, operate on, examine, and experiment on a body or
- 22 anatomical specimen distributed under this chapter.
- 23 (c) A law relating to the prevention of mutilation of a body
- 24 does not apply to the use of a body as authorized under this section
- 25 <u>or</u> a dissection, operation, examination, or experiment performed
- 26 under this section.
- 27 (d) To aid prosecutions under Section 42.08, Penal Code, the

- 1 board shall adopt rules that clearly state the activities that are
- 2 authorized by the board in relation to the use or dissection of a
- 3 body.
- 4 SECTION 9. Sections 691.034(a), (c), and (d), Health and
- 5 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) The board shall inspect and may approve institutions and
- 7 persons for the receipt and use of bodies and anatomical specimens
- 8 under this chapter.
- 9 (c) The board may suspend or revoke a person's or
- 10 institution's authorization to receive and <u>use or</u> dissect bodies or
- 11 anatomical specimens if the board determines that the person or
- 12 institution has improperly used a body or anatomical specimen.
- 13 (d) A person or institution is entitled to a hearing before
- 14 the board or a hearing examiner appointed by the board before the
- 15 board may revoke the person's or institution's authorization to
- 16 receive and use or dissect bodies or anatomical specimens. The
- 17 board shall make all final decisions to suspend or revoke an
- 18 authorization.
- 19 SECTION 10. Section 692A.002, Health and Safety Code, is
- 20 amended by adding Subdivision (11-a) to read as follows:
- 21 (11-a) "Education" with respect to the purposes
- 22 authorized by law for making an anatomical gift includes training
- 23 of search and rescue animals.
- SECTION 11. Sections 692A.011(a) and (b), Health and Safety
- 25 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 26 (a) An anatomical gift may be made to the following persons
- 27 named in the document of gift:

- 1 (1) an organ procurement organization to be used for
- 2 transplantation, therapy, research, or education;
- 3
  (2) a hospital to be used for research;
- 4 (3) subject to Subsection (d), an individual
- 5 designated by the person making the anatomical gift if the
- 6 individual is the recipient of the part;
- 7 (4) an eye bank or tissue bank, except that use of a
- 8 gift of a whole body must be coordinated through the Anatomical
- 9 Board of the State of Texas;
- 10 (5) a forensic science program at:
- 11 (A) a general academic teaching institution as
- 12 defined by Section 61.003, Education Code; or
- 13 (B) a private or independent institution of
- 14 higher education as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code; [or]
- 15 (6) a person who trains animals to assist in search and
- 16 rescue activities conducted by a law enforcement agency; or
- 17 (7) the Anatomical Board of the State of Texas.
- (b) Except for donations described by Subsections (a)(1)
- 19 through (6)  $[\frac{(5)}{(5)}]$ , the Anatomical Board of the State of Texas shall
- 20 be the donee of gifts of bodies or parts of bodies made for the
- 21 purpose of education or research that are subject to distribution
- 22 by the board under Chapter 691.
- 23 SECTION 12. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
