A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 relating to the offense of failure to report abuse or neglect of a

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 261.109, Family Code, is amended to read

6 as follows:

7 Sec. 261.109. FAILURE TO REPORT; PENALTY. (a) A person

8 commits an offense if the person is required to make a report under

9 Section 261.101(a) [has cause to believe that a child's physical or

10 mental health or welfare has been or may be adversely affected by

11 abuse or neglect] and knowingly fails to make a report as provided

12 in this chapter.

13 <u>(a-1)</u> A person who is a professional as defined by Section

14 261.101(b) commits an offense if the person is required to make a

15 report under Section 261.101(b) and knowingly fails to make a

16 report as provided in this chapter.

17 (b) An offense under Subsection (a) [this section] is a

18 Class A misdemeanor, except that the offense is a state jail felony

19 if it is shown on the trial of the offense that the child was a

20 person with an intellectual disability [mental retardation] who

21 resided in a state supported living center, the ICF-MR component of

22 the Rio Grande State Center, or a facility licensed under Chapter

23 252, Health and Safety Code, and the actor knew that the child had

24 suffered serious bodily injury as a result of the abuse or neglect.

- 1 (c) An offense under Subsection (a-1) is a Class A
- 2 misdemeanor, except that the offense is a state jail felony if it is
- 3 shown on the trial of the offense that the actor intended to conceal
- 4 the abuse or neglect.
- 5 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act to Section
- 6 261.109, Family Code, apply only to an offense committed on or after
- 7 the effective date of this Act. An offense committed before the
- 8 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 9 date the offense was committed, and the former law is continued in
- 10 effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense
- 11 was committed before the effective date of this Act if any element
- 12 of the offense occurred before that date.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
