- 6 SECTION 2. Section 545.401, Transportation Code, is amended
- 7 by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (e), (f), and (g)

- 9 (b) An offense under this section is a <u>Class B</u> misdemeanor

- 11 $\left[\frac{(1)}{a}\right]$ a fine not to exceed \$200;
- 12 [(2) confinement in county jail for not more than 30

- [(3) both the fine and the confinement].
- 15 (e) The court may:
- 16 (1) order that the driver's license of a person
- 17 convicted of an offense under Subsection (a) be suspended for not

- 14 this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of
