1	AN ACT
2	relating to reporting concerning selection of certain suppliers by
3	insurers; providing an administrative penalty.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 38, Insurance Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter J to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER J. REPORTING OF EFFORTS BY CERTAIN INSURERS
8	Sec. 38.451. APPLICABILITY OF SUBCHAPTER. (a) This
9	subchapter applies only to an insurer that:
10	(1) is authorized to engage in the business of
11	insurance in this state, including any insurer described by Section
12	82.002(a); and
13	(2) wrote premiums in this state of at least \$100
14	million in the calendar year before the year in which a report is
15	due under this subchapter.
16	(b) This subchapter does not apply to a contract between an
17	insurer and an agent.
18	Sec. 38.452. FILING OF CERTAIN INFORMATION CONCERNING
19	SUPPLIERS. (a) An insurer shall file with the commissioner not
20	later than June 1 of each even-numbered year a report detailing the
21	insurer's efforts to use businesses owned by minorities, women, and
22	disabled veterans as suppliers of goods or services.
23	(b) The report must contain:
24	(1) the insurer's diversity policy statement;

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1	(2) a description of the insurer's outreach and
2	communication efforts, including:
3	(A) a description of how the insurer encourages
4	and seeks out businesses owned by minorities, women, and disabled
5	veterans to become suppliers;
6	(B) a description of how the insurer encourages
7	its employees involved in selecting suppliers to seek out
8	businesses owned by minorities, women, and disabled veterans to
9	become suppliers;
10	(C) a description of how the insurer conducts
11	outreach to and communicates with potential suppliers that are
12	businesses owned by minorities, women, and disabled veterans;
13	(D) a description of how the insurer supports
14	organizations that promote or certify businesses as businesses
15	owned by minorities, women, and disabled veterans; and
16	(E) a description of how businesses owned by
17	minorities, women, and disabled veterans may contact the insurer
18	about supplier opportunities;
19	(3) information about the insurer's selection as
20	suppliers businesses owned by minorities, women, and disabled
21	veterans that have a majority of the businesses' workforce located
22	in this state, with each category aggregated separately to the
23	extent that information is readily accessible; and
24	(4) other relevant information the insurer chooses to
25	include.
26	(c) If an insurer does not enter into contracts to obtain
27	goods or services in this state, it may file with the commissioner a

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1	statement attesting that the insurer does not enter into those
2	contracts in this state to satisfy the reporting requirements of
3	this subchapter.
4	(d) An insurer that is a member of an insurance holding
5	company system as described by Chapter 823 may comply with the
6	reporting requirements in this subchapter through a single filing
7	on behalf of the entire group of affiliated companies.
8	(e) If the commissioner receives a written request from an
9	insurer that states a good cause that additional time is required to
10	file a report required under this subchapter, the commissioner may
11	grant a 30-day extension of the time for the insurer to file the
12	report.
13	Sec. 38.453. ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY. (a) An insurer that
14	fails to file a report as required by this subchapter is subject to
15	an administrative penalty under Chapter 84. Except as provided by
16	Subsection (b), the amount of the penalty may not exceed \$5,000.
17	(b) An insurer that wilfully fails to file a report as
18	required by this subchapter or wilfully fails to reply not later
19	than the 30th day after the date the insurer receives a written
20	inquiry from the department about the filing of the report is

21 <u>subject to an administrative penalty in an amount not to exceed</u>
22 <u>\$10,000.</u>

23 <u>Sec. 38.454. EFFECT OF REQUIRED REPORTING. (a) This</u> 24 <u>subchapter may not be construed as requiring quotas, set-asides, or</u> 25 <u>preferences in an insurer's selection of suppliers for goods or</u> 26 <u>services.</u>

27 (b) An insurer retains the authority to use business

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1	judgment to select a supplier to obtain particular goods or
2	services.
3	Sec. 38.455. PUBLIC INFORMATION. Not later than September
4	1 of each even-numbered year the department shall post the data
5	contained in the reports filed under this subchapter on the
6	department's Internet website. The commissioner by rule may
7	establish a procedure for posting data under this section that
8	includes a description of the data that must be posted and the
9	manner in which the data must be posted.
10	Sec. 38.456. RULES. The commissioner may adopt rules
11	necessary to implement this subchapter.
12	Sec. 38.457. EXPIRATION. This subchapter expires January
13	<u>1, 2020.</u>
14	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
