A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the authority of a judge to impose a period of 3 confinement in a county jail for a violation of a condition of 4 community supervision.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 12, Article 42.12, Code of Criminal 7 Procedure, is amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding 8 Subsections (d) and (e) to read as follows:

9 (a) If a judge having jurisdiction of a misdemeanor case requires as a condition of community supervision that the defendant 10 submit to a period of confinement in a county jail, the period of 11 12 confinement may not exceed 30 days. Except as provided by Subsection (e), if [If] a judge having jurisdiction of a felony case 13 14 requires as a condition of community supervision that the defendant submit to a period of confinement in a county jail, the period of 15 16 confinement may not exceed 180 days.

(d) In addition to any other authority granted under this 17 article, a judge having jurisdiction of a felony case, after 18 providing to the defendant a written warning that clearly 19 communicates the consequences of violating a condition of community 20 supervision, including the ability of the judge to modify the 21 community supervision under Section 22, require the defendant to 22 23 serve a period of confinement in a county jail as a condition of community supervision under Subsection (e), or revoke the community 24

supervision under Section 23, may require the defendant to serve a
period of confinement under Subsection (e) in addition to the
maximum period provided by Subsection (a).
(e) In addition to the confinement authorized under
Subsection (a), a judge may order a defendant to serve a period of
confinement in a county jail as a condition of community
supervision if the judge determines that the defendant violated a
condition of community supervision after receiving the warning
provided by Subsection (d). The period of confinement may not
exceed:
(1) three days for a first violation;
(2) seven days for a second violation;
(3) 14 days for a third violation; and
(4) 21 days for a fourth or subsequent violation.
SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to a
person placed on community supervision on or after the effective
date of this Act regardless of when the person committed the offense
for which the person is placed on community supervision.
SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
