Art. 7A.03. REQUIRED FINDINGS; ISSUANCE OF PROTECTIVE 1 ORDER. (a) At the close of a hearing on an application for a 2 protective order under this chapter, the court shall find whether 3 there are reasonable grounds to believe that the applicant is the 4 5 victim of sexual assault or abuse, [; or] stalking, or trafficking.

6 (b) If the court makes a finding described by Subsection (a) [(a)(1) or (2)], the court shall issue a protective order that 7 8 includes a statement of the required findings.

9 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act in amending Article 7A.03, Code of Criminal Procedure, applies only to a 10 protective order issued on or after the effective date of this Act. 11 A protective order issued before the effective date of this Act is 12 governed by the law in effect on the date the order is issued, and 13 14 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
