| 5 | SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter A, Chapter 229, Local |
| 6 | Government Code, is amended to read as follows: |
| 7 | SUBCHAPTER A. REGULATION OF WEAPONS [FIREARMS] AND EXPLOSIVES |
| 8 | SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 229, Local Government |
| 9 | Code, is amended by adding Section 229.005 to read as follows: |
| 10 | Sec. 229.005. ELECTRIC STUN GUNS; KNIVES; PERSONAL DEFENSE |
| 11 | SPRAYS. (a) In this section: |
| 12 | (1) "Electric stun gun" means a device that is: |
| 13 | (A) sold commercially for personal protection; |
| 14 | and |
| 15 | (B) designed, made, or adapted for the purpose of |
| 16 | emitting an electrical charge or current intended to temporarily |
| 17 | disable a person. |
| 18 | (2) "Knife" has the meaning assigned by Section 46.01, |
| 19 | Penal Code. |
| 20 | (3) "Personal defense spray" means a small chemical |
| 21 | dispenser that is: |
| 22 | (A) sold commercially for personal protection; |
| 23 | and |
| 24 | (B) designed, made, or adapted for the purpose of |

- 1 dispensing a substance capable of causing an adverse psychological
- 2 or physiological effect on a human being.
- 3 (b) Notwithstanding any other law, a municipality may not
- 4 adopt or enforce an ordinance or other regulation relating to the
- 5 private ownership, keeping, carrying, transportation, licensing,
- 6 or registration of an electric stun gun, a knife, or a personal
- 7 defense spray.
- 8 <u>(c) Subsection (b) does not affect the authority of a</u>
- 9 municipality to:
- 10 (1) enforce Sections 46.02, 46.03, and 46.05, Penal
- 11 Code; or
- 12 (2) adopt or enforce an ordinance or other regulation
- 13 prohibiting a person, for purposes of entering a restricted area,
- 14 from carrying an electric stun gun, a knife, or a personal defense
- 15 spray past a metal detector or magnetometer used to screen for
- 16 weapons.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
