5 SECTION 1. Section 26.045, Local Government Code, is

7 Sec. 26.045. FILLING VACANCY ON GOVERNING BODY OF

8 MUNICIPALITY WITH POPULATION OF 1.5 MILLION OR MORE. (a) Except as

9 provided by Subsection (b), if $[\frac{1}{1}]$ a vacancy occurs on the

10 governing body of a municipality with a population of 1.5 million or

11 more and more than 270 days remain before the date of the next

12 general election of members of the governing body, the governing

13 body shall order a special election in the district in which the

14 vacancy occurred, or in the entire municipality if the vacancy

15 occurred in an at-large position, to fill the vacancy. The special

16 election shall be held on an authorized uniform election date

17 prescribed by the Election Code that occurs before the general

18 election and that allows enough time to hold the election in the

19 manner required by law and shall be conducted in the same manner as

20 the municipality's general election except as provided by

21 provisions of the Election Code applicable to special elections to

22 fill vacancies.

23 (b) This section does not apply to a municipality that has

24 provided by charter or charter amendment a different procedure to

- 1 fill a vacancy on its governing body for which the unexpired term is
- 2 <u>12 months or less.</u>
- 3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect on the date on which the
- 4 constitutional amendment proposed by the 83rd Legislature, Regular
- 5 Session, 2013, authorizing a home-rule municipality to provide in
- 6 its charter the procedure to fill a vacancy on its governing body
- 7 for which the unexpired term is 12 months or less is approved by the
- 8 voters. If that amendment is not approved by the voters, this Act
- 9 has no effect.
