1 (7) evaluate the type and quality of data needed to: 2 monitor (A) adequately demographic and socioeconomic changes in the population of the state; and 3 4 (B) assess the effectiveness of delivery of state 5 services; and 6 (8) investigate the characteristics and trends of 7 abortion in Texas and the socioeconomic impact of abortion on the state, and annually include its findings in a report to the 8 legislature and the public. SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 13

Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
