8	(a) In this section, "voluntary charity care" has the meaning
9	assigned by board rule under Section 256.102.
10	(b) The board shall grant a temporary license for a dentist
11	whose practice consists only of voluntary charity care to a
12	reputable dentist who:
13	(1) meets the requirements of Sections 256.101(a)(3),
14	(4), and (5);
15	(2) ceased practicing dentistry in another state not
16	more than two years before the date the dentist applies for a
17	license under this section; and
18	(3) was licensed in good standing as a dentist in
19	another state at the time the dentist ceased practicing dentistry

- 23 (c) A dentist issued a license under this section shall:
- (1) confine the dentist's practice to voluntary 24

in that state, if the board determines the licensing requirements

of that state are substantially equivalent to the requirements of

- 1 charity care;
- 2 (2) practice only in a geographic area specified by
- 3 the license; and
- 4 (3) practice only for the period specified by the
- 5 license.
- 6 (d) The board shall adopt rules as necessary to implement
- 7 this section.
- 8 SECTION 2. The State Board of Dental Examiners shall adopt
- 9 rules as necessary to implement Section 256.1016, Occupations Code,
- 10 as added by this Act, not later than January 1, 2014.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
