- 11 only the polling places located in the territory or in and near the

- 14 SECTION 2. Section 43.007(a), Election Code, is amended to

- 16 (a) The secretary of state shall implement a program to

- 20 (1) each general election for state and county
- 21 officers;

- 2 (4) each primary election and runoff primary election
- 3 <u>if:</u>
- 4 (A) the county chair or county executive
- 5 committee of each political party participating in a joint primary
- 6 <u>election under Section 172.126 agrees to the use of countywide</u>
- 7 polling places; or
- 8 (B) the county chair or county executive
- 9 committee of each political party required to nominate candidates
- 10 by primary election agrees to use the same countywide polling
- 11 places; and
- 12 (5) each election of a political subdivision located
- 13 in the county that is held jointly with an election described by
- 14 Subdivision (1), (2), (3), or (4) [(3)].
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
