A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to regulation of certain combative sports activities. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 2052.002(20), Occupations 4 Code, is 5 amended to read as follows: physician" individual 6 (20) "Ringside means an licensed to practice medicine in this state who is assigned as the 7 physician for a combative sports event [registered with the 8 9 department]. SECTION 2. Section 2052.052(b), Occupations Code, 10 is 11 amended to read as follows: 12 (b) The commission may adopt rules: 13 (1) governing boxing, kickboxing, martial arts, or 14 mixed martial arts contests and exhibitions; (2) establishing reasonable qualifications for 15 an applicant seeking a license or registration from the department 16 under this chapter; 17 18 (3) recognizing a sanction, medical suspension, or disqualification of a licensee or registrant by a combative sports 19 authority in any state, provided that if licensure or registration 20 21 is denied based on those actions, an applicant has an opportunity for a hearing as prescribed by rule; 22 23 (4) establishing <u>selection criteria and procedures</u> for the assignment of ringside physicians and timekeepers for 24

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1 <u>combative sports events</u> [practice requirements or specialty
2 certifications that a person licensed to practice medicine in this
3 state must meet to register as a ringside physician];

4 requiring a contestant to present (5) with an 5 application for licensure or license renewal documentation of recent blood test results that demonstrate whether the contestant 6 free from hepatitis B virus, hepatitis C virus, 7 is human 8 immunodeficiency virus, and any other communicable disease designated by commission rule and providing that a contestant's 9 10 failure to provide the required blood test results disqualifies the 11 contestant;

12 (6) providing that to participate in any event a 13 contestant must be free of hepatitis B virus, hepatitis C virus, 14 human immunodeficiency virus, and any other communicable disease 15 designated by rule;

16 (7) requiring that a contestant present with an 17 application for licensure or license renewal documentation of the 18 results of a physical examination, including an ophthalmologic 19 examination, and providing for disqualification of a contestant who 20 is determined by an examining physician to be unfit;

21 (8) establishing additional responsibilities for 22 promoters; and

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(9) governing regulated amateur events.

24 SECTION 3. Section 2052.107, Occupations Code, is amended 25 to read as follows:

26 Sec. 2052.107. OTHER COMBATIVE SPORTS LICENSES. Unless a 27 person holds a license or registration issued under this chapter,

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1	the person may not act as a combative sports:
2	 professional contestant;
3	(2) manager of a professional contestant;
4	<pre>(3) referee;</pre>
5	(4) judge;
6	(5) second;
7	(6) [timekeeper;
8	[(7)] matchmaker;
9	[(8) ringside physician;] or
10	(7) [(9)] event coordinator.

SECTION 4. (a) A disciplinary or administrative proceeding pending under Chapter 51 or 2052, Occupations Code, that is related to a violation of licensing or registration requirements for a timekeeper or ringside physician under Chapter 2052, Occupations Code, as that chapter existed immediately before the effective date of this Act is dismissed.

17 (b) An administrative penalty assessed by the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation or the executive director of 18 the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation under Chapter 19 2052, Occupations Code, related to a violation of Chapter 2052, 20 Occupations Code, as that chapter existed immediately before the 21 effective date of this Act, may be collected as provided by Chapter 22 23 51, Occupations Code.

(c) The change in law made by this Act does not affect the
pending prosecution of an offense under Chapter 2052, Occupations
Code, as that chapter existed immediately before the effective date
of this Act. An offense committed before the effective date of this

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1 Act is governed by the law in effect at the time the offense was 2 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that 3 purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed 4 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense 5 occurred before that date.

6 (d) Not later than November 1, 2013, the Texas Department of 7 Licensing and Regulation shall return a prorated portion of the fee 8 paid to the department for the issuance or renewal of the 9 registration or license to a person who holds a valid registration 10 as a ringside physician or timekeeper issued under Chapter 2052, 11 Occupations Code, as that chapter existed immediately before the 12 effective date of this Act.

13 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
