A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1-17 1-18 excluding certain short-term employment from relating to unemployment compensation chargebacks and grounds for benefit 1-19 disqualification.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-21 SECTION 1. Section 204.022, Labor Code, is amended by 1-22 1-23 adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:

(a-1) Benefits computed on benefit wage credits of an 1-24 employee or former employee may not be charged to the account of an 1-25 employer if:

(1) 1-26 the employment did not constitute suitable work 1-27 1-28 for the employee, as determined under Section 207.008; and (2) the employee worked for the employer for less than

1-29 four weeks.

1-30 SECTION 2. Section 207.045, Labor Code, is amended by adding Subsection (g-1) to read as follows: 1-31

(g-1) An individual who voluntarily leaves the individual's last work is not disqualified for benefits under this section if: 1-32 1-33

(1) at the time the last work began, the individual was 1-34 1-35

receiving benefits under this subtitle; (2) the work did not constitute suitable work for the individual, as determined under Section 207.008; and (3) the individual was employed at the last work for 1-36 1-37

1-38 1-39 less than four weeks. 1-40 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to

1-41 a claim for unemployment compensation benefits filed with the Texas 1-42 Workforce Commission on or after the effective date of this Act. A claim filed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the 1-43 law in effect on the date the claim was filed, and the former law is 1 - 441-45 continued in effect for that purpose. SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
