5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. The heading to Section 51.356, Occupations Code,
7	is amended to read as follows:
8	Sec. 51.356. DEFERRED ADJUDICATION <u>FOR SEX OFFENDER</u> ;
9	LICENSE SUSPENSION, LICENSE REVOCATION, OR DENIAL OR REFUSAL TO
10	RENEW LICENSE.
11	SECTION 2. Section 51.356(a), Occupations Code, is amended
12	to read as follows:
13	(a) The commission may deny, suspend, revoke, or refuse to
14	renew a license or other authorization issued by a program
15	regulated by the department if <u>:</u>
16	(1) [the commission determines that a deferred
17	adjudication makes] the person holding or seeking the license
18	received deferred adjudication for an offense for which the person
19	would be required to register as a sex offender under Chapter 62,
20	Code of Criminal Procedure; and
21	(2) the commission determines that the deferred
22	adjudication makes the person unfit for the license.
23	SECTION 3. Section 53.021(d), Occupations Code, is amended
24	to read as follows:

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1 (d) A licensing authority may consider a person to have been 2 convicted of an offense for purposes of this section regardless of 3 whether the proceedings were dismissed and the person was 4 discharged as described by Subsection (c) if:

5 (1) the person was charged with an offense that would 6 require the person to register as a sex offender under Chapter 62, 7 <u>Code of Criminal Procedure; and</u>

8 (2) [7] after consideration of the factors described 9 by Sections 53.022 and 53.023(a), the licensing authority 10 determines that:

11 (A) [(1)] the person may pose a continued threat 12 to public safety; or

13 <u>(B)</u> [(2)] employment of the person in the 14 licensed occupation would create a situation in which the person 15 has an opportunity to repeat the prohibited conduct.

SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies to an application for, or a disciplinary proceeding regarding, a license or other authorization that is pending with a licensing authority on the effective date of this Act or an application filed or a disciplinary proceeding commenced on or after that date.

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
