A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

_	AN ACT

- 2 relating to education programs regarding homosexual conduct.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 85.007(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (b) The materials in the education programs intended for
- 7 persons younger than 18 years of age must[+
- 8 $\left[\frac{(1)}{(1)}\right]$ emphasize sexual abstinence before marriage and
- 9 fidelity in marriage as the expected standard in terms of public
- 10 health and the most effective ways to prevent HIV infection,
- 11 sexually transmitted diseases, and unwanted pregnancies[; and
- 12 [(2) state that homosexual conduct is not an
- 13 acceptable lifestyle and is a criminal offense under Section 21.06,
- 14 Penal Code].
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 163.002, Health and Safety Code, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 163.002. INSTRUCTIONAL ELEMENTS. Course materials and
- 18 instruction relating to sexual education or sexually transmitted
- 19 diseases should include:
- 20 (1) an emphasis on sexual abstinence as the only
- 21 completely reliable method of avoiding unwanted teenage pregnancy
- 22 and sexually transmitted diseases;
- 23 (2) an emphasis on the importance of self-control,
- 24 responsibility, and ethical conduct in making decisions relating to

- 1 sexual behavior;
- 2 (3) statistics, based on the latest medical
- 3 information, that indicate the efficacy of the various forms of
- 4 contraception;
- 5 (4) information concerning the laws relating to the
- 6 financial responsibilities associated with pregnancy, childbirth,
- 7 and child rearing;
- 8 (5) information concerning the laws prohibiting
- 9 sexual abuse and the legal and counseling options available to
- 10 victims of sexual abuse;
- 11 (6) information on how to cope with and rebuff
- 12 unwanted physical and verbal sexual advances, as well as the
- 13 importance of avoiding the sexual exploitation of other persons;
- 14 and
- 15 (7) psychologically sound methods of resisting
- 16 unwanted peer pressure[; and
- 17 [(8) emphasis, provided in a factual manner and from a
- 18 public health perspective, that homosexuality is not a lifestyle
- 19 acceptable to the general public and that homosexual conduct is a
- 20 criminal offense under Section 21.06, Penal Code].
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
