## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

 AN ACT

- 2 relating to passenger security screening and reporting by certain
- 3 local government airport operators.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 23, Transportation Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows: Sec. 23.002. COMMISSIONING OF EMPLOYEES AS PEACE
- 7 OFFICERS. (a) The governing body may commission an employee of an
- 8 airport security force established under this chapter as a peace
- 9 officer, subject to Subchapter C, Chapter 415, Government Code,
- 10 <u>Subchapter G, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code</u>, if the employee gives
- 11 an oath and a bond for the faithful performance of the employee's
- 12 duties as required by the governing body.
- 13 SECTION 2. Chapter 23, Transportation Code, is amended by
- 14 adding Section 23.004 to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 23.004. SCREENING PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM. (a) In this
- 16 section, "airport operator" means:
- 17 (1) a local government that owns or controls an
- 18 <u>airport; or</u>
- (2) a person who operates, as the agent of a local
- 20 government or otherwise, an airport owned or controlled by the
- 21 <u>local government.</u>
- (b) Not later than January 1, 2014, an airport operator
- 23 shall apply to the Under Secretary of Transportation for Security
- 24 under 49 U.S.C. Section 44920 to participate in the security

- 1 screening opt-out program.
- 2 (c) The airport operator shall submit the following
- 3 information to the Director of the Texas Department of Public
- 4 Safety and the executive director of the Texas Department of
- 5 Transportation:
- 6 (1) not later than the 30th day after an application
- 7 <u>has been submitted under Subsection (b)</u>, a written statement that
- 8 an application has been submitted;
- 9 (2) not later than the 30th day after receiving the
- 10 notice, a copy of the notice of the disposition of the application;
- 11 and
- 12 (3) not later than January 31, 2019, a written
- 13 statement regarding any failure to receive a notice of the
- 14 disposition of the application.
- 15 (d) an airport operator that fails to comply with subsection
- 16 (b) may not receive state funding for the operation of the airport.
- 17 (e) This section expires August 31, 2019.
- 18 SECTION 3. Chapter 23, Transportation Code, is amended by
- 19 adding Section 23.005 to read as follows:
- Sec. 23.005. PASSENGER COMPLAINT REPORT. (a) In this
- 21 section, "airport operator" means:
- 22 (1) a local government that owns or controls an
- 23 <u>airport; or</u>
- (2) a person who operates, as the agent of a local
- 25 government or otherwise, an airport owned or controlled by the
- 26 local government.
- (b) Not later than January 1, 2015 and on January 1 of each

- 1 year thereafter, an airport operator shall submit the following
- 2 information to the Director of the Texas Department of Public
- 3 Safety and the executive director of the Texas Department of
- 4 Transportation:
- 5 (1) a written report describing the number and nature
- 6 of complaints received by the airport operator from passengers
- 7 concerning the behavior of Transportation Security Administration
- 8 agents.
- 9 (c) The written report submitted pursuant to Subsection (b)
- 10 shall not include the identification of passengers or information
- 11 that would compromise the privacy or security of passengers.
- 12 (d) This section expires August 31, 2019.
- SECTION 4. Chapter 23, Transportation Code, is amended by
- 14 adding Section 23.006 to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 23.006 REPORT TO THE CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION. Before
- 16 the end of each even-numbered year, the director of the governor's
- 17 Office of Homeland Security shall prepare and submit to the Texas
- 18 Congressional delegation a report making recommendations regarding
- 19 <u>airport security screening.</u>
- 20 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
