## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 1701.4525, Occupations
- 6 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 1701.4525. PETITION FOR MODIFICATION [CORRECTION] OF
- 8 REPORT; HEARING[ + ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY].
- 9 SECTION 2. Sections 1701.4525(a), (d), and (e), Occupations
- 10 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 11 (a) A person who is the subject of an employment termination
- 12 report maintained by the commission under this subchapter may
- 13 contest the category of discharge stated [information contained] in
- 14 the report by submitting to the law enforcement agency and to the
- 15 commission a written petition on a form prescribed by the
- 16 commission for a modification [correction] of the report not later
- 17 than the 30th day after the date the person receives a copy of the
- 18 report. On receipt of the petition, the commission shall refer the
- 19 petition to the State Office of Administrative Hearings.
- 20 (d) A proceeding to contest the category of discharge stated
- 21 [information] in an employment termination report is a contested
- 22 case under Chapter 2001, Government Code.
- (e) In a proceeding to contest the category of discharge
- 24 stated [information] in an employment termination report for a

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- 1 report based on alleged misconduct, an administrative law judge shall determine if the alleged misconduct 2 occurred by a 3 preponderance of the evidence regardless of whether the person who is the subject of the report was terminated or the person resigned, 4 5 retired, or separated in lieu of termination. If the alleged misconduct is not supported by a preponderance of the evidence, the 6 administrative law judge shall issue a final order directing the 7 8 commission, through the executive director, to prepare and sign a modified report in accordance with the final order. The commission 9 10 shall replace the contested report with the modified report in the
- SECTION 3. Section 1701.4525(e-1), Occupations Code, is repealed.

- SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act to Section 1701.4525, Occupations Code, apply only to a petition for the modification of an employment termination report submitted on or after the effective date of this Act. A petition submitted before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the petition was submitted, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 5. The repeal Act of Section 22 bу this 23 1701.4525(e-1), Occupations Code, does not affect the validity of a 24 proceeding initiated or an administrative penalty imposed under that section before the effective date of this Act. A proceeding 25 26 initiated or an administrative penalty imposed under that section before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in 27

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- 1 effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the
- 2 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 3 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
