- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as Chelsea's Law.
- 6 SECTION 2. Sections 22.021(e) and (f), Penal Code, are
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (e) An offense under this section is a felony of the first
- 9 degree, except as provided by Subsection (f).
- 10 (f)(1) An offense under this section is a felony of the
- 11 first degree, punishable by imprisonment in the Texas Department of
- 12 Criminal Justice for life or for any term of not more than 99 years
- 13 or less than [The minimum term of imprisonment for an offense under
- 14 this section is increased to] 25 years, if at the time of the
- 15 offense the defendant is younger than 18 years of age and:
- (A) $\left[\frac{1}{1}\right]$ the victim of the offense is younger
- 17 than six years of age [at the time the offense is committed]; or
- 18 $\underline{\text{(B)}}$ [$\frac{\text{(2)}}{\text{)}}$] the victim of the offense is younger
- 19 than 14 years of age [at the time the offense is committed] and the
- 20 actor commits the offense in a manner described by Subsection
- 21 (a)(2)(A).
- 22 (2) An offense under this section is a felony of the
- 23 first degree, punishable by imprisonment in the Texas Department of
- 24 Criminal Justice for life without parole, if at the time of the

- 1 offense the defendant is 18 years of age or older and:
- 2 (A) the victim of the offense is younger than six
- 3 years of age;
- 4 (B) the victim of the offense is younger than 14
- 5 years of age and the actor commits the offense in a manner described
- 6 by Subsection (a)(2)(A); or
- 7 (C) the victim of the offense is younger than 17
- 8 years of age and suffered serious bodily injury as a result of the
- 9 offense.
- 10 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 11 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 12 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 13 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 14 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 15 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 16 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 17 before that date.
- 18 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
