A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the public school educator excellence innovation
- 3 program.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter O, Chapter 21,
- 6 Education Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 SUBCHAPTER O. EDUCATOR EXCELLENCE INNOVATION [AWARDS] PROGRAM
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 21.701, Education Code, is amended to
- 9 read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 21.701. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "program"
- 11 means the educator excellence innovation [awards] program.
- 12 SECTION 3. Subchapter O, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
- 13 amended by adding Section 21.7011 to read as follows:
- Sec. 21.7011. PURPOSES. The purposes of the educator
- 15 excellence innovation program are to:
- 16 (1) systemically transform:
- 17 (A) educator quality and effectiveness through
- 18 improved and innovative school district-level recruitment,
- 19 preparation, hiring, induction, evaluation, professional
- 20 development, strategic compensation, career pathways, and
- 21 retention; and
- 22 (B) district administrative practices to improve
- 23 quality, effectiveness, and efficiency; and
- 24 (2) use the enhanced educator and administrative

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- 1 quality and effectiveness to improve student learning and student
- 2 academic performance, especially the learning and academic
- 3 performance of students enrolled in districts that:
- 4 (A) receive federal funding under Title I of the
- 5 Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. Section
- 6 6301 et seq.); and
- 7 (B) have at a majority of district campuses a
- 8 student enrollment of which at least 50 percent is educationally
- 9 disadvantaged.
- 10 SECTION 4. The heading to Section 21.702, Education Code,
- 11 is amended to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 21.702. EDUCATOR EXCELLENCE INNOVATION [AWARDS]
- 13 PROGRAM.
- SECTION 5. Sections 21.702(a) and (b), Education Code, are
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 (a) The commissioner by rule shall establish the [an
- 17 educator excellence awards] program under which school districts,
- 18 in accordance with local educator excellence innovation [awards]
- 19 plans approved by the commissioner, receive competitive program
- 20 grants from the agency for carrying out the purposes of the program
- 21 <u>as described</u> [purpose of providing awards to district employees in
- 22 the manner provided] by Section 21.7011 [$\frac{21.705}{}$].
- 23 (b) In establishing the program, the commissioner shall
- 24 adopt program guidelines in accordance with this subchapter for a
- 25 school district to follow in developing a local educator excellence
- 26 innovation [awards] plan under Section 21.704.
- 27 SECTION 6. Section 21.703, Education Code, is amended to

- 1 read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 21.703. EDUCATOR EXCELLENCE INNOVATION FUND; AMOUNT OF
- 3 GRANT AWARD. $[\frac{(a)}{a}]$ Each state fiscal year, the commissioner shall
- 4 deposit an amount determined by the General Appropriations Act to
- 5 the credit of the educator excellence innovation fund in the
- 6 general revenue fund. Each state fiscal year, the agency shall use
- 7 money [funds] in the educator excellence innovation fund to provide
- 8 <u>each</u> [a qualifying] school district approved on a competitive basis
- 9 <u>under this subchapter with</u> a grant in an amount determined by <u>the</u>
- 10 agency in accordance with commissioner rule [+
- 11 [(1) dividing the amount of money available for
- 12 distribution in the educator excellence fund by the total number of
- 13 students in average daily attendance in qualifying districts for
- 14 that fiscal year; and
- 15 [(2) multiplying the amount determined under
- 16 Subdivision (1) by the number of students in average daily
- 17 attendance in the district].
- 18 SECTION 7. Section 21.704, Education Code, is amended to
- 19 read as follows:
- Sec. 21.704. LOCAL EDUCATOR EXCELLENCE INNOVATION [AWARDS]
- 21 PLANS. (a) A district-level committee for a school district that
- 22 intends to participate in the program, such as the district-level
- 23 planning and decision-making committee established under
- 24 Subchapter F, Chapter 11, shall develop a local educator excellence
- 25 <u>innovation</u> [awards] plan for the district. The local <u>educator</u>
- 26 excellence innovation [awards] plan may provide for all campuses in
- 27 the district to participate in the program or only certain campuses

- 1 selected by the district-level committee. [A majority of classroom
- 2 teachers assigned to a campus that is selected by the
- 3 district-level committee to participate in the program must approve
- 4 participation to be included in the local awards plan.
- 5 (c) A school district <u>must</u> [shall] submit a local <u>educator</u>
- 6 <u>excellence innovation</u> [awards] plan to the agency for approval.
- 7 [The plan must be submitted together with evidence of significant
- 8 teacher involvement in the development of the plan.
- 9 (c-1) A local educator excellence innovation [awards] plan
- 10 must be designed to carry out each purpose of the program as
- 11 <u>described</u> by <u>Section 21.7011</u> [provide for teachers and principals
- 12 eligible to receive awards under the plan to be notified of the
- 13 specific criteria and any formulas on which the awards will be based
- 14 before the beginning of the period on which the awards will be
- 15 based].
- 16 (d) The agency may approve only a local educator excellence
- 17 <u>innovation</u> [awards] plan that meets program guidelines adopted by
- 18 the commissioner under Section 21.702 and that satisfies this
- 19 section and Section 21.706 [21.705]. From among the local educator
- 20 <u>excellence innovation plans submitted and depending on the amount</u>
- 21 of money available for distribution in the educator excellence
- 22 <u>innovation fund</u>, the agency shall approve plans that most
- 23 comprehensively and innovatively address the purposes of the
- 24 program as described by Section 21.7011 so that the effectiveness
- 25 of various plans in achieving those purposes can be compared and
- 26 evaluated.
- 27 (e) [The agency shall make model local awards plans

- 1 available to school districts that wish to participate in the
- 2 program.
- 3 [(f)] A school district whose local <u>educator excellence</u>
- 4 <u>innovation</u> [awards] plan is approved by the agency to receive a
- 5 program grant under this subchapter may renew the plan for three
- 6 consecutive school years without resubmitting the plan to the
- 7 agency for approval. A school district may amend a local educator
- 8 excellence innovation [awards] plan for approval by the agency for
- 9 each school year the district receives a program grant.
- 10 SECTION 8. Subchapter O, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
- 11 amended by adding Sections 21.706 and 21.7061 to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 21.706. INNOVATION PLAN PAYMENTS; AUTHORIZED GENERAL
- 13 AND SPECIFIC USES. A school district may use grant funds awarded to
- 14 the district under this subchapter only to carry out purposes of the
- 15 program as described by Section 21.7011, in accordance with the
- 16 <u>district's local educator excellence innovation plan</u>, which may
- 17 include the following specific methods or procedures:
- 18 (1) implementation and administration of a
- 19 high-quality mentoring program for teachers in a teacher's first
- 20 three years of classroom teaching using mentors who meet the
- 21 qualifications prescribed by Section 21.458(b);
- 22 (2) implementation of a teacher evaluation system
- 23 <u>using multiple measures that include:</u>
- 24 (A) the results of classroom observation, which
- 25 may include student comments;
- 26 (B) the degree of student educational growth and
- 27 learning; and

1	(C) the results of teacher self-evaluation;
2	(3) to the extent permitted under Subchapter C,
3	Chapter 25, restructuring of the school day or school year to
4	provide for embedded and collaborative learning communities for the
5	purpose of professional development; and
6	(4) establishment of an alternative teacher
7	compensation or retention system.
8	Sec. 21.7061. IMPLEMENTATION FLEXIBILITY. (a)
9	Notwithstanding any other provision of this code and subject to
10	Subsection (b), a school district may apply to the commissioner in
11	writing in accordance with commissioner rule for a waiver to exempt
12	the district or one or more district campuses from Subchapter H or J
13	or from Section 21.402, as specified in the waiver application, but
14	only if the waiver is required to carry out purposes of the program
15	as described by Section 21.7011, in accordance with the district's
16	local educator excellence innovation plan.
17	(b) Before an application for a waiver is submitted to the
18	commissioner under Subsection (a), the application specifying the
19	provision or subchapter for which the waiver is sought must be
20	approved by a vote of:
21	(1) a majority of the members of the school district
22	board of trustees; and
23	(2) a majority of the teachers and other staff members
24	at each campus for which the waiver is sought.
25	(c) The commissioner shall grant or deny an application
26	under this section based on standards adopted by commissioner rule.
27	(d) Neither the board of trustees of a school district nor

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- 1 the district superintendent may compel a waiver of rights under
- 2 this section.
- 3 SECTION 9. Section 21.705, Education Code, is repealed.
- 4 SECTION 10. This Act applies beginning with the 2014-2015
- 5 school year.
- 6 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 7 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 8 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 9 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 10 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
