A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to authorizing the board of regents of The University of
- 3 Texas System to acquire certain property in the city of Arlington.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The board of regents of The University of Texas
- 6 System may acquire by purchase, exchange, gift, or otherwise, for
- 7 campus expansion and other university purposes of The University of
- 8 Texas at Arlington, all or part of the property in the city of
- 9 Arlington, Tarrant County, Texas, that is included within the area
- 10 with the boundaries specifically described as follows:
- BEGINNING at the corner of E. 3rd Street and South Center
- 12 Street;
- 13 THENCE South along South Center Street to the intersection of
- 14 South Center Street and East Mitchell Street;
- 15 THENCE East along East Mitchell Street to the intersection of
- 16 East Mitchell Street and South Mesquite Street;
- 17 THENCE North along South Mesquite Street to the intersection
- 18 of South Mesquite Street and E. 3rd Street;
- 19 THENCE West along E. 3rd Street to the beginning intersection
- 20 at the corner of E. 3rd Street and South Center Street.
- 21 SECTION 2. The title to the property shall be taken in the
- 22 name of the board of regents of The University of Texas System and
- 23 shall be subject to the control and management of the board in the
- 24 manner and to the extent that the property now owned by The

- 1 University of Texas System in fee simple is held and controlled.
- 2 SECTION 3. This Act does not grant the state or The
- 3 University of Texas System the power of eminent domain over the
- 4 property.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
