(a) 8 A person that provides to individuals with developmental 9 [<del>disability</del>] services disabilities may contract with a state supported living [school or 10 state] center for the [school or] center to provide services and 11 resources to support those individuals [with developmental 12 disabilities, including individuals with dual diagnosis 13 14 disorders]. (b) Notwithstanding any other law, a state supported living 15 [school or state] center may provide nonresidential services to 16 support an individual if: 17 (1) the individual: 18

- 9 property from public or private sources to expand and improve the
- 10 human services programs for the aging and disabled available in
- 11 this state.
- 12 (b) The department shall use a gift or grant of money,
- 13 personal property, or real property made for a specific purpose in
- 14 accordance with the purpose expressly prescribed by the donor. The
- 15 department may decline the gift or grant if the department
- 16 determines that it cannot be economically used for that purpose.
- 17 (c) The department shall keep a record of each gift or grant
- 18 in the department's central office in the city of Austin.
- SECTION 3. Sections 22.001(f) and 101.026, Human Resources
- 20 Code, are repealed.
- 21 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
