A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 relating to the regulation of certain metal dealers; providing a

- 3 criminal penalty.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1956.001(8), Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (8) "Personal identification document" means:
- 8 (A) a valid driver's license issued by a state in
- 9 the United States;
- 10 (B) a United States military identification
- 11 card; [or]
- 12 (C) a personal identification certificate issued
- 13 by the department under Section 521.101, Transportation Code, or a
- 14 corresponding card or certificate issued by another state;
- (D) a passport; or
- 16 (E) documentation issued by the United States
- 17 agency responsible for citizenship and immigration that authorizes
- 18 the person to be in the United States.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 1956.0612, Occupations Code, is amended
- 20 by adding Subsection (h) to read as follows:
- 21 (h) The commissioner may not register a person as a dealer
- 22 if the person, in the calendar year preceding the calendar year for
- 23 which the person seeks to act as a dealer, fails to comply with any
- 24 requirement of Section 1956.062.

- 1 SECTION 3. Section 1956.062, Occupations Code, is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 1956.062. RECORD [REPORT] OF PURCHASE OR EXCHANGE
- 4 REQUIRED. (a) A dealer shall maintain an accurate record of [, as
- 5 required by Section 1956.063, report] all identifiable crafted
- 6 precious metal that the dealer purchases, takes in trade, accepts
- 7 for sale on consignment, or accepts for auction.
- 8 (b) The record [Before crafted precious metal is offered for
- 9 sale or exchange, a dealer must notify each person intending to sell
- 10 or exchange the metal that, before the dealer may accept any of the
- 11 person's property, the person must file with the dealer a list
- 12 describing all of the person's crafted precious metal to be
- 13 accepted by the dealer. The list] must include [contain]:
- 14 (1) the date of the transaction;
- 15 (2) the name and physical address of the dealer;
- 16 <u>(3)</u> the [proposed] seller's name <u>as listed on the</u>
- 17 seller's personal identification document;
- 18 (4) the identifying number of the seller's personal
- 19 identification document;
- 20 (5) the physical [and] address at which the seller is
- 21 residing at the time of the transaction;
- 22 (6) the seller's sex, height, date of birth, and eye
- 23 <u>color</u>;
- (7) $[\frac{(2)}{(2)}]$ a complete and accurate description of the
- 25 crafted precious metal that includes:
- 26 (A) the number of items accepted;
- 27 (B) for each item accepted, the size, weight, and

- 1 length of the item, and the material from which the item is made;
- 2 (C) for each item accepted that contains a
- 3 precious metal, the color, weight, purity, and type of each
- 4 precious metal;
- 5 (D) the color, number, size, and approximate
- 6 weight of any stone included in the items accepted; and
- 7 <u>(E) other identifying characteristics of the</u>
- 8 items accepted;
- 9 (8) a digital or video photograph that accurately
- 10 depicts each item accepted; and
- 11 $\underline{(9)}$ [$\overline{(3)}$] the [$\overline{proposed}$] seller's certification that:
- 12 (A) the information in the record is true and
- 13 complete; and
- 14 (B) the seller is the legal owner of or is
- 15 lawfully entitled to transfer the crafted precious metal.
- 16 (c) [The dealer shall record the proposed seller's driver's
- 17 license number or department personal identification certificate
- 18 number on physical presentation of the license or personal
- 19 identification certificate by the seller. The record must
- 20 accompany the list.
- 21 $\left\lceil \frac{\text{(d)}}{\text{)}} \right\rceil$ The dealer shall:
- 22 (1) provide to a peace officer, on demand, the <u>record</u>
- 23 [list] required by this section [Subsection (b)]; and
- 24 (2) except as provided by Subsection (d), mail or
- 25 deliver a complete copy of the record [list] to the chief of police
- 26 or the sheriff as provided by Section 1956.063 not later than 48
- 27 hours after the time the transaction occurs [list is filed with the

- 2 (d) The chief of police or the sheriff may provide for
- 3 electronic submission of a record under Subsection (c)(2).
- 4 (e) In addition to the report required by Subsection (c)(2),
- 5 the commissioner shall by rule require a dealer to report all
- 6 crafted precious metal described by Subsection (a) to the Internet
- 7 <u>database designated under Subsection (f) not later than the end of</u>
- 8 the business day in which the transaction occurred.
- 9 <u>(f) For purposes of Subsection (e), the commissioner shall</u>
- 10 designate an Internet database that is designed to collect
- 11 information from businesses regarding certain transactions and to
- 12 make that information available to law enforcement agencies to
- 13 assist the agencies in solving crimes.
- 14 (g) In this section, "seller" includes a transferor who
- 15 exchanges, or offers to exchange, crafted precious metal with a
- 16 dealer.
- 17 SECTION 4. Section 1956.063(c), Occupations Code, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 (c) For each transaction for which the dealer is required by
- 20 Section 1956.062 to maintain a record [regulated by this
- 21 subchapter], the dealer shall submit a report on a preprinted and
- 22 prenumbered form prescribed by the commissioner. The form must
- 23 include the <u>information required to be included in the record</u>
- 24 [following:
- 25 [(1) the date of the transaction;
- 26 [(2) a description of the crafted precious metal
- 27 purchased by the dealer;

- 1 [(3) the name and physical address of the dealer; and
- 2 [(4) the name, physical description, and physical
- 3 address of the seller or transferor].
- 4 SECTION 5. Subchapter B, Chapter 1956, Occupations Code, is
- 5 amended by adding Section 1956.0631 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 1956.0631. PAYMENT FOR CRAFTED PRECIOUS METAL
- 7 PURCHASED. A dealer may pay for a purchase of crafted precious
- 8 metal only by check or prepaid debit card. If payment is by check,
- 9 the names of the dealer and seller must be printed on the check. If
- 10 payment is by prepaid debit card, the seller may not be liable for
- 11 any fees charged by the issuer of the card.
- 12 SECTION 6. Section 1956.064(a), Occupations Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) A dealer may not melt, deface, alter, or dispose of
- 15 crafted precious metal that is the subject of a report required by
- 16 this subchapter before the 11th day after the date the report is
- 17 filed unless:
- 18 (1) the peace officer to whom the report is submitted,
- 19 for good cause, authorizes disposition of the metal; or
- 20 (2) [the dealer obtains the name, address, and
- 21 description of the buyer and retains a record of that information;
- 22 or
- [(3)] the dealer is a pawnbroker and the disposition
- 24 is the redemption of pledged property by the pledgor.
- 25 SECTION 7. Section 1956.069(a), Occupations Code, is
- 26 amended to read as follows:
- 27 (a) A person commits an offense if the person:

- 1 (1) fails to make or permit inspection of a report as
- 2 required by Section 1956.062 or 1956.063;
- 3 (2) violates Section 1956.0612, 1956.0631, or
- 4 1956.064;
- 5 (3) fails to obtain or retain a statement as required
- 6 by Section 1956.066;
- 7 (4) fails to file a registration statement as required
- 8 by Section 1956.067; or
- 9 (5) purchases an object in violation of Section
- 10 1956.068.
- 11 SECTION 8. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 12 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 13 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 14 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 15 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 16 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 17 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 18 before that date.
- 19 SECTION 9. Not later than November 1, 2013, the consumer
- 20 credit commissioner shall prescribe the form required by Section
- 21 1956.063, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act.
- SECTION 10. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of
- 23 this section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
- (b) Section 1956.063(c), Occupations Code, as amended by
- 25 this Act, takes effect December 1, 2013.
