	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to the regulation of certain interior designers.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 1051.001, Occupations Code, is amended
5	by adding Subdivision (2-a) to read as follows:
6	(2-a) "Hospital" means a public or private institution
7	licensed under Chapter 241 or 577, Health and Safety Code,
8	including a general hospital or a special hospital, as those terms
9	are defined by Section 241.003, Health and Safety Code.
10	SECTION 2. Section 1053.151, Occupations Code, is amended
11	to read as follows:
12	Sec. 1053.151. REGISTRATION [REQUIRED]. <u>(a) The board</u>
13	shall issue a certificate of registration under this chapter to a
14	person who:
15	(1) practices interior design as it relates to the
16	interior environment or space of a hospital; and
17	(2) meets the requirements of this chapter and board
18	<u>rules.</u>
19	(b) Except as provided by Subsection (a), the board may not
20	issue or renew a certificate of registration to a person engaged in
21	the practice of interior design.
22	<u>(c)</u> A person other than an interior designer may
23	not represent that the person is a "registered interior designer"
24	by using that title or by using words that imply that the person is a

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1 registered interior designer.

2 SECTION 3. Section 1053.152(a), Occupations Code, is 3 amended to read as follows:

4 (a) The board shall establish the qualifications for the
5 issuance or renewal of a certificate of registration under this
6 chapter to a person who practices interior design as it relates to
7 the interior environment or space of a hospital.

8 SECTION 4. Section 1053.351(a), Occupations Code, is 9 amended to read as follows:

10 (a) A person commits an offense if the person knowingly 11 violates Section <u>1053.151(c)</u> [1053.151] or a standard of conduct 12 adopted under this chapter.

SECTION 5. The change in law made by this Act applies only 13 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. 14 15 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect at the time the offense was committed, 16 17 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the 18 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred 19 before that date. 20

21 SECTION 6. Not later than October 1, 2013, the Texas Board 22 of Architectural Examiners shall adopt rules necessary to implement 23 Section 1053.151, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act.

24 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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1 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
