## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to safe patient handling and movement practices at
3	hospitals and nursing homes.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 256.002(b), Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	(b) The policy shall [establish a process that, at a
8	<pre>minimum, includes]:</pre>
9	(1) <u>include an</u> analysis of the risk of injury to
10	[both] patients, [and] nurses, and other direct-care staff members
11	posed by the patient handling needs of the patient populations
12	served by the hospital or nursing home and the physical environment
13	in which patient handling and movement occurs;
14	(2) <u>require</u> education of nurses <u>and other</u>
15	direct-care staff members in the identification, assessment, and
16	control of risks of injury to patients <u>,</u> [ <del>and</del> ] nurses <u>,</u> and other
17	direct-care staff members during patient handling and movement,
18	including training on:
19	(A) the proper use of lifting devices and
20	equipment;
21	(B) proper manual lifting technique;
22	(C) the benefit of team lifts and potential risks
23	of single-person lifts; and

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(D) [(3) evaluation of] alternative ways to

- 1 reduce risks associated with patient handling, including the use
- 2 [evaluation] of equipment for moving patients and the use of the
- 3 environment;
- 4 (3) restrict  $[\frac{(4) \text{ restriction}}{(4) \text{ restriction}}]$ , to the extent
- 5 feasible with existing equipment and aids, [of] manual patient
- 6 handling or movement of all or most of a patient's weight to
- 7 emergency, life-threatening, or otherwise exceptional
- 8 circumstances;
- 9  $\underline{\text{(4) provide for}}$  [ $\overline{\text{(5)}}$ ] collaboration with and annual
- 10 report to the nurse staffing committee;
- 11 (5) prohibit retaliation or discrimination against a
- 12 <u>nurse or other direct-care staff member who refuses</u> [<del>(6) procedures</del>
- 13 for nurses to refuse] to perform or be involved in patient handling
- 14 or movement that the nurse or other direct-care staff member
- 15 believes in good faith will expose a patient or a nurse or other
- 16 <u>direct-care staff member</u> to an unacceptable risk of injury;
- 17 (6) require [(7)] submission of an annual report to
- 18 the governing body or the quality assurance committee on activities
- 19 related to the identification, assessment, and development of
- 20 strategies to control risk of injury to patients, [and] nurses, and
- 21 other direct-care staff members associated with the lifting,
- 22 transferring, repositioning, or movement of a patient; and
- 23 <u>(7)</u> [<del>(8)</del>] in the development of [developing</del>]
- 24 architectural plans for constructing or remodeling a hospital or
- 25 nursing home or a unit of a hospital or nursing home in which
- 26 patient handling and movement occurs, require consideration of the
- 27 feasibility of incorporating patient handling equipment or the

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- 1 physical space and construction design needed to incorporate that
- 2 equipment at a later date.
- 3 SECTION 2. A hospital or nursing home shall adopt and
- 4 implement a policy required by Section 256.002(b), Health and
- 5 Safety Code, as amended by this Act, not later than January 1, 2014.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- B provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
