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3 SECTION 2. A hospital or nursing home shall adopt and
4 implement a policy required by Section 256.002(b), Health and
5 Safety Code, as amended by this Act, not later than January 1, 2014.
6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

10 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
