The medical center shall, to the maximum extent practicable, use all stationery and other consumable supplies that are printed with the institution's former name and are in its possession on the 9-9 9-10 9-11 9-12 effective date of this Act. 9-13

SECTION 18. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.

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
