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- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 28.022(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (a) The board of trustees of each school district shall
- 9 adopt a policy that:
- 10 (1) provides for a conference between parents and
- 11 teachers;
- 12 (2) requires the district, at least once every 12
- 13 weeks, to give written notice to a parent of:
- 14 (A) a student's performance in each class or
- 15 subject; and
- (B) the number of students that, on the last day
- 17 of the period for which the notice is given, were enrolled in each
- 18 of the student's classes, including the class for a particular
- 19 subject; and
- 20 (3) requires the district, at least once every three
- 21 weeks, or during the fourth week of each nine-week grading period,
- 22 to give written notice to a parent [or legal guardian] of:
- 23 (A) a student's performance in a subject included
- 24 in the foundation curriculum under Section 28.002(a)(1) if the

- 1 student's performance in the subject is consistently
- 2 unsatisfactory, as determined by the district; and
- 3 (B) the number of students that, on the last day
- 4 of the period for which the notice is given, were enrolled in the
- 5 student's class for the subject for which the notice is given.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2013-2014
- 7 school year.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
