A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the administration by certain health care professionals
- 3 of treatments, therapy, or medication ordered by an optometrist or
- 4 therapeutic optometrist.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 301.002(2), Occupations Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (2) "Professional nursing" means the performance of an
- 9 act that requires substantial specialized judgment and skill, the
- 10 proper performance of which is based on knowledge and application
- 11 of the principles of biological, physical, and social science as
- 12 acquired by a completed course in an approved school of
- 13 professional nursing. The term does not include acts of medical
- 14 diagnosis or the prescription of therapeutic or corrective
- 15 measures. Professional nursing involves:
- 16 (A) the observation, assessment, intervention,
- 17 evaluation, rehabilitation, care and counsel, or health teachings
- 18 of a person who is ill, injured, infirm, or experiencing a change in
- 19 normal health processes;
- 20 (B) the maintenance of health or prevention of
- 21 illness;
- (C) the administration of a medication or
- 23 treatment as ordered by a physician, podiatrist, [ex] dentist, or
- 24 therapeutic optometrist;

- 1 (D) the supervision or teaching of nursing;
- 2 (E) the administration, supervision, and
- 3 evaluation of nursing practices, policies, and procedures;
- 4 (F) the requesting, receiving, signing for, and
- 5 distribution of prescription drug samples to patients at sites in
- 6 which a registered nurse is authorized to sign prescription drug
- 7 orders as provided by Subchapter B, Chapter 157;
- 8 (G) the performance of an act delegated by a
- 9 physician under Section 157.052, 157.053, 157.054, 157.0541,
- 10 157.0542, 157.058, or 157.059; and
- 11 (H) the development of the nursing care plan.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 453.001(9), Occupations Code, is amended
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 (9) "Referring practitioner" means a qualified
- 15 licensed health care professional who, within the scope of
- 16 professional licensure, may refer a person for health care
- 17 services. The term includes:
- 18 (A) a physician licensed to practice medicine by
- 19 a state board of medical examiners;
- 20 (B) a dentist licensed by a state board of dental
- 21 examiners;
- (C) a chiropractor licensed by a state board of
- 23 chiropractic examiners; [and]
- (D) a podiatrist licensed by a state board of
- 25 podiatric medical examiners; and
- 26 <u>(E) an optometrist or therapeutic optometrist</u>
- 27 licensed by a state board of optometry.

- 1 SECTION 3. Section 454.213(b), Occupations Code, is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 (b) Implementation of direct occupational therapy to a
- 4 person for a specific health care condition must be based on a
- 5 referral from:
- 6 (1) a physician licensed by a state board of medical
- 7 examiners;
- 8 (2) a dentist licensed by a state board of dental
- 9 examiners;
- 10 (3) a chiropractor licensed by a state board of
- 11 chiropractic examiners;
- 12 (4) a podiatrist licensed by a state board of
- 13 podiatric medical examiners; [er]
- 14 (5) <u>an optometrist or</u> therapeutic optometrist
- 15 licensed by a state board of optometry; or
- 16 <u>(6)</u> another qualified, licensed health care
- 17 professional who is authorized to refer for health care services
- 18 within the scope of the professional's license.
- 19 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
