- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 411.052(a) and (b), Government Code,
- are amended to read as follows: 6
- 7 (a) Ιn this section, "federal prohibited person
- information" means information that identifies an individual as: 8
- 9 a person ordered by a court to receive inpatient
- mental health services under Chapter 574, Health and Safety Code; 10
- 11 a person acquitted in a criminal case by reason of
- 12 insanity or lack of mental responsibility, regardless of whether
- the person is ordered by a court to receive inpatient treatment or 13
- 14 residential care under Chapter 46C, Code of Criminal Procedure;
- a person determined to have mental retardation and 15
